The first half belonged to the youthful Bangladesh bowlers, who were not intimidated by the big names in Michael Vaughan's England line-up and shot their oppoents out for 253 shortly after tea.

Amazingly three key batsmen apart from Trescothick fell in 14 deliveries with the score on 181. Enamul snared three of them with a probing line and intelligent use of fliaht.



But skipper Steve Waugh said after his team had won the first Test in this country between the sides by an innings and 175 runs that he had eared the combination of flinty Zimbabwe resolve and threatening veather could combine to thwart his "The rain was menacing and there was a thought that we would

It was the highest second innings score by Zimbabwe in their 11-year history in Test ranks. Zimbabwe's brave resistance was finally broken after the last-

wicket pair, skipper Heath Streak and Ray Price, had kept vigil for just over two hours, adding 74 runs the biggest last-wicket Test stand in Perth. They were skittled for 239 in their


