# Bangaliana -- all about going Bangla savvy

WILL technology put paper dictionaries out of business? It would take software with a large word database to make paper dictionaries obsolete. But in the meantime, a very inexpensive CD-ROM could benefit any computer user who wants an immediate translation of Bangla words to English.

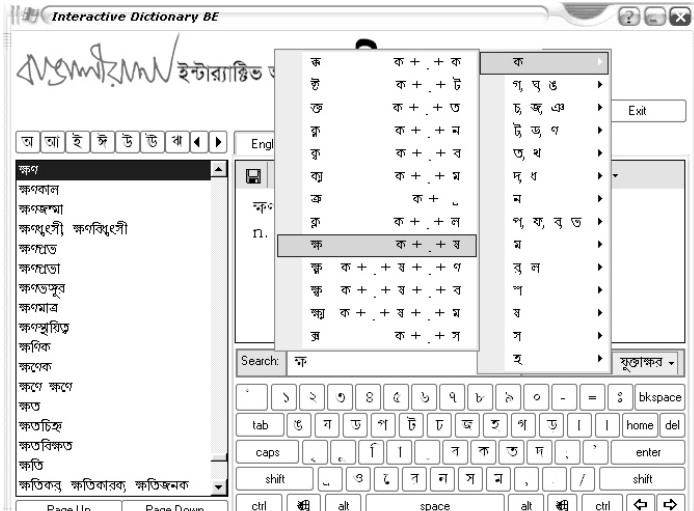
Interactive dictionary 'Bangaliana' is a digital Bangla-to-English dictionary designed to give one more aptitude and reliance than a paper dictionary. Moreover, it also has the ability to find out any of the 30,000 words it has in a second. And it costs only Tk 180.

The demo of 'Bangaliana' was first displayed at BCS Computer Show 2003 and the first version was released at Computer Mela 2003, Comilla. The present version 'Bangaliana Interactive Dictionary BE 1.50' was released in August 14, 2003 and comes with many new features.

The concept, design and programming of the dictionary has been done by Omaar Osman, managing director of Bangaliana along with his four friends Amanullah Siddique, S.M. Aneyet Kobir Faisal, Joshimuddin and Mohammad Kawsar.

"In 2002, I did a survey of our local software and realised that they are poor in quality which makes most of the user lose interest in Bangla software. So I decide to form a company, which will be dedicated to Bangla computing and give the users some international standard software. Thus Bangaliana was born," said Omaar.

After finishing his diploma in multimedia from Hi-tech



An explained Bangla conjunct menu makes it easier to understand

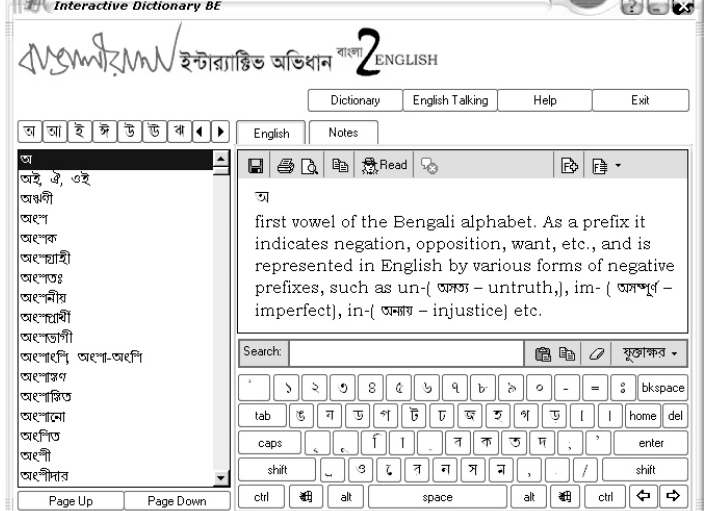
Professionals in 2000 Omaar completed Web Master course from World Wide Web Institute in 2002.

Visual Basic 6 was used to create 'Bangaliana'. Omaar also used some high quality utilities to make the software powerful,

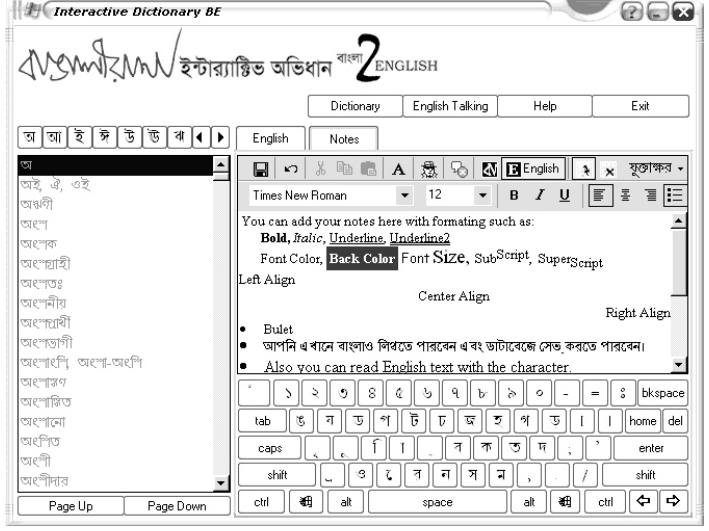
write Bangla in interactive dictionary. Writing tools such as a virtual Bangla keyboard and an explained Bangla conjunct menu are also included. An advanced

Note Pad is also included to keep personal notes with each Bangla word.

notes can be saved as PDF. To find out accurate pronunciation of English words or sentences there are six animated characters powered by Microsoft Agent Control. These characters read documents or English word(s)/sentence(s).

The dictionary has a standard User Interface (UI) for all version of Windows. Recently it has been noticed that the dictionary sometimes cannot produce sounds while reading texts but after some attempts it reads texts normally. This problem occurs on some computers running Windows 98/ME, but the problem does not occur in Windows 2000 or Windows XP platform. Omaar said that is not a programming flaw and hopes to fix the problem soon.

Bangaliana's website, www.bangaliana.com invites its users to share their experience and ideas. Bangaliana also wishes to make their website a recourse for Bangla computing. They hope to publish Bangla software for both personal and commercial uses.

# Nasa runs laser-powered model plane

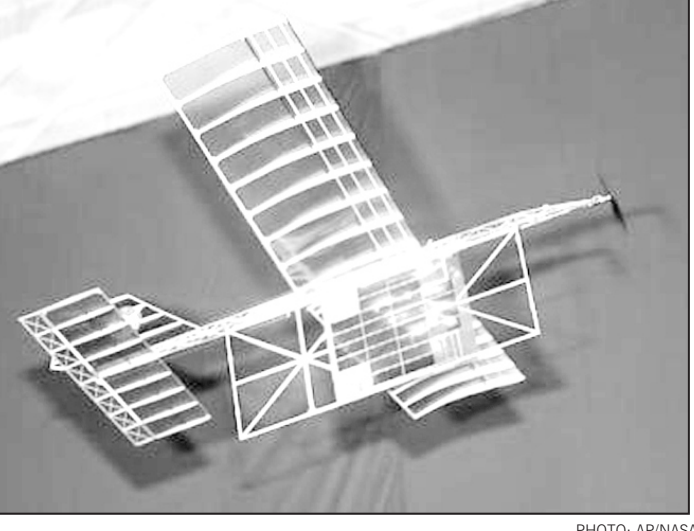
NASA has built and flown a remote-controlled plane powered from the ground by the beam of an invisible laser.

In indoor flights conducted last month at a Nasa center in Alabama, the plane flew lap after lap, gliding to a landing once the laser beam was turned off, the agency said Thursday.

While in flight, the laser tracked the 11-ounce, five-foot-wingspan plane, striking the photovoltaic cells that powered the tiny motor that turned its lone propeller.

"The craft could keep flying as long as the energy source, in this case the laser beam, is uninterrupted," said Robert Burdine, laser project manager for the tests, conducted at the Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Ala.

In earlier flights completed last year, engineers manually traced the path flown by the

plane with a theatrical spotlight that provided the power needed to turn its propeller.

The remote-controlled planes don't have to carry their own fuel or batteries, providing more room for scientific instruments or communications equipment.

Scientists envision flying the

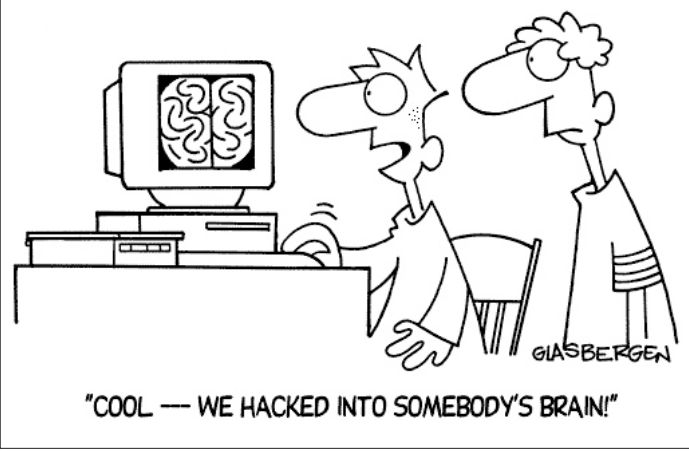
planes on long-duration flights to monitor the environment, including erupting volcanos. The planes also could be used for surveillance or to provide communications links.

"The aircraft could be used for everything from relaying cell phone calls to cable television or Internet connections," said David Bushman, project manager for beamed power at Dryden Flight Research Center at Edwards, where the plane was designed and built.

The plane is not the first to capitalize on laser power. A team of Japanese researchers announced last year they successfully flew a paper airplane on bursts of laser light.

That team's approach differed, however: the blasts of laser heated drops of water on the plane's one-inch wings, turning them to puffs of vapor that pushed the aircraft forward.
