Aussies rush to victory

Matthew Havden scored a quickfire unbeaten 101 as Australia raced to a nine-wicket victory over Zimbabwe Monday with more than a day to spare in the second and final cricket Test at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

The Australians were set 172 runs to win and passed that target from just 29.1 overs to complete a 2-0 series sweep over the gritty but outgunned tourists, who lost for the 11th straight match.

Hayden, 31, scored his 16th Test century and took his total runs for the series to 501 with a majestic innings that came from just 85 balls in 140 minutes and included 11 fours and three sixes.

The left-hander made a world record 380 in the first Test in Perth, which the Australians won by an innings and 175 runs.

Australia lost opener Justin Langer for eight, caught behind by Tatenda Taibu from a Heath Streak off-cutter, but Hayden and first innings century-maker Justin Langer (53 not out) then settled in and played some extravagant strokes.

Too many one-day internationals are leaving players "stale, bored and injured," according to former Pakistan all-rounder Wasim Akram.

Hectic one-day schedules were also affecting the quality of players coming into the game, said Akram, the only bowler to take more than

500 one-day wickets. "There should be 10-12 Tests in a year and 30 one-dayers, not 40 plus," Akram told reporters on Monday after signing up as a television commentator with sports channel ESPN Star Sports.

Akram announced his international retirement in May after he was dropped following Pakistan's first round exit in the February-March World Cup in South Africa before recently quitting all cricket.

"The chances of injuries in oneday cricket are more," he said. "I judge a player's calibre in Tests because in one-dayers even the average player can look good.'

India's Sunil Gavaskar and former England opener Geoffrey Boycott also last month urged the International Cricket Council to try and reduce the number of onedayers being played by the top teams

After losing last week's first Test by an innings and 175 runs, a much improved Zimbabwe forced Australia to chase a tricky second innings target of 172 to win.

Australia reached their target for the loss of just one wicket with Matthew Hayden blasting an unbeaten hundred and Ricky Ponting making a half-century, but not without a few anxious moments. "It was great for us to be in a position to make Australia bat again," Streak said.

"We actually thought we had a chance, but maybe the guys got a little too excited because we gave away some soft dismissals." Hayden, who scored a world




