

greedy landlord as well as a generous

person who gave land and money to the

poor. One thing about Hasan Raja is certain

he was a true original who wrote songs of

great depth and feeling that are still relevant

to Bengali speaking people today. We hope

Imtiaz Ahmed In this book the author sets forth that, although conceptually and in appearance state and foreign policy appear fragmented and independent, in reality they are related, albeit dialectically, socially and politically. The central thesis, therefore, is that one understands the relationship between state and foreign policy from the standpoint of dialectics. It is, therefore, first and foremost a methodological application exposition. The methodological application of dialectics, however, compels the author to examine the subject not only on the level of theoretical abstraction but also at the more important level of social reality. 

Price: Tk. 290.00 Human Rights in Bangladesh 2002 is not merely an inventory of abuses of human rights or violations of constitutional guarantees. It tries to identify the reasons for a socio-political development hat tends to exclude a majority of citizens rom a meaningful participation which would enable them to access resources and opportunities. The chapters in this volume are reflective and analytical, identifying systemic and institutional weaknesses that act as a constraint on the practice of constitutional principles. The authors, who are well known in their own field of studies or have actively defended human rights, have examined the reasons for violations in particular of the right to torture, ill treatment, arbitrary arrest and detention, freedom of assem bly and movement and prison conditions. Several chapters have presented findings on the deprivation of social and economic ights of workers in garment factories, in shrimp farming areas and the right to



shelter. Rights of particular groups of citizens, such as minorities, women and children focus particularly on their vulnerabilities.


The information and analyses presented in this volume raise more than academic concerns It also describes citizens' actions in preventing and promoting human rights and will be of use to activists, defenders of human rights and hopefully to policy makers to recognize the need for establishing democratic norms and human rights in the society and state.



Zainul Abedin Nazrul Islam

Price: Tk. 300.00 Zainul Abedin (1914-1976) is the pioneer of the modern art movement in Bangladesh He founded the Government Institute of Arts at Dhaka in 1948. Abedin came into eminence at only 29 through his unforgettaole sketches of the 1943 Bengal famine. With these brush sketches in black ink done in Calcutta, Abedin became the first important Sub-continental artist of social realism

and an artist of the down trodden. Subsequently Abedin went through several phases of stylistic transformations, such as the water colour landscapes of oriental sensitivity or the stylized romantic figuratives in guache and oil of the fifties pased on folk-motifs depicting village maidens, and finally the return to brush drawings with black ink in the late sixties and early seventies. However, whatever the style or technique, Abedin had always remained close to the common people, from whom he himself had come, by faithfully depicting their land, their life and their almost unending struggles. In his art has there been a wonderful synthesis of the artistic-tradition of the East and the West.
