Aziz Stadium here on Wednesday. The CJKS officials are definitely upbeat having been promised adequate funds from the sponsors for the Test and the first one-day international on November 7. The last time the port city staged a Test match seven months ago it was not a very successful one as far as the financial rewards were concerned. But with the Tigers' recent signs

of improvement the CJKS is expecting a bonanza. They are also expecting a good response from the local cricket fans. Besides, at least
