# India's revenge

Sachin Tendulkar struck 100 and Vangipurappu Laxman a stylish 102 as India reversed the World Cup final result by beating world champions Australia by 37 runs.

Tendulkar, whose failure against Australia in the Cup final earlier this year sealed India's fate, recorded his 35th one-day century in Sunday's TVS Cup triangular series

For Laxman, meanwhile, it was a second one-day international hundred as the pair came together for a 191-run stand, laying the foundation for India's 284 for five on a flat, slow wicket.

Sunday was his day, however, as the 30-year-old hammered nine fours and a six in his 119-ball stay.

India had started badly, losing opener Sehwag for a three-ball duck after stand-in captain Rahul Dravid
