Edinho's new assignment

Former Brazilian international defender Edinho has been appointed coach of Brazilian first division side Bahia, club president Marcelo Guimaraes confirmed Tuesday.

Edinho, who played for Brazil in three World Cup finals, replaces Lula Pereira, who was sacked along with all his technical staff after four losses in a row which leave the club sitting bottom of the league.

Edinho, who was sacked by Brazilian side Goias two months ago for poor results, is the fourth coach this season at Bahia.

Scholes out of action

Manchester United midfielder Paul Scholes will be out of action for up to four weeks after undergoing surgery on his troublesome groin problem

The England player suffered the groin problem earlier this season and it flared up again.

A club spokesman said: "Paul Scholes' groin problem has reoccurred and he has had to have surgery this morning to both groins. He is likely to be out for three to four

The 28-year-old will almost certainly miss United's league games against Liverpool and Chelsea in November as well as two Champions League ties against Rangers and Panathinaikos

Scholes is uncertain for England's friendly with Denmark at Old Trafford on November 16 as a result of the operation.

Woodgate set for **Newcastle return**

England and Newcastle defender Jonathan Woodgate, out of action for the past month with a hernia problem, could return against Chelsea next month.

The 23-year-old underwent surgery to repair a double hernia, but is progressing so well in training that manager Bobby Robson has had to warn him not to overdo it.

But he is now within a fortnight of being ready to play, and that could mean the trip to Stamford Bridge on November 9.

"Jonathan is doing phenomenally well bearing in mind the seriousness of his operation, and he's looking to really kick on this week. To be honest, we're having to hold him back," physio Paul Ferris told The Journal

"Realistically, he should be ready to push for a first-team place in two weeks' time, and everyone has been impressed with his progress."

Woodgate picked up the problem during the club's pre-season trip to Malaysia, but played for a month before finally having to undergo surgery five weeks ago.

United multiply Leeds' woes

Premiership leader's Arsenal survived a scare before advancing to the fourth round of the English League Cup with a penalty-shootout victory over plucky Rotherham on Tuesday, as debt-ridden Leeds United fell 3-2 to Manchester

The Gunners, fielding a reserve team, triumphed 9-8 on penalties against the Division One side after the score ended 1-1 after 120 minutes at Highbury. Premiership strugglers Leeds

United ended one of the darkest days in the club's history in misery as they went down in extra-time at Elland Road

On a day when club bosses announced record losses of 49.5

million pounds (83.8 million dollars) Leeds woes were compounded after Eric Djemba-Djemba steered Man United into the fourth round with an extra-time goal.

Arsenal took the lead after 11 minutes through young French striker Jeremie Aliadiere, but Rotherham fought back and striker Darren Byfield headed home an equaliser in the 90th minute. But it was the Premiership team

who held firm in the penalties as Sylvain Wiltord scored his second spot-kick after Chris Swailes had seen his effort saved. Leeds defender Roque Junior

scored a brace either side of goals from David Bellion and Diego Forlan, but it was Cameroon international Djemba-Djemba who had the final say with a winner just three minutes from the end of extra-time.

After Diego Forlan's goal in the 107th minute, Roque Junior allowed Leeds to level with a goal off his knee, but Djemba-Djemba settled the tie by steering a lob into goal from Quinton Fortune's corner.

Manchester City fielded a strong team away at Nationwide Two promotion seekers Queens Park Rangers and cruised through to the next round 3-0.

Shaun Wright-Phillips gave the Premiership side the lead in the first half before doubling the advantage with quarter of an hour remaining. Jonathon Macken completed the rout minutes later.

Southampton comfortably won 3-0 at Bristol City, with Wolverhampton Wanderers easing past Burnley at Molineux 2-0.

Bolton were little threatened by visiting Gillingham winning 2-0 after Stelios Giannakopoulos gave the Trotters a half-time lead and Henrik Pedersen settled matters **SEE PAGE 14**

German League Cup Hertha scrape thru'

Thai PM wants to buy Fulham

Thai Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra has said he is interested in buying football club Fulham after watching the Premier League side beat English champions Manchester United at the weekend.

Thaksin told reporters on Wednesday he had talked to Fulham chairman Mohamed Al Fayed, who also owns luxury west London department store Harrods, during his holiday in Britain when he

saw the shock 3-1 win over United at Old Trafford on Saturday.

"I met Al Fayed over the weekend and teased him that I was interested in buying Fulham and he told me to come back to talk to him when I was seriously interested," Thaksin said.

"We are studying how Brazil has developed its kids to become good football players and we would like to inspire our children to be rising stars of the Premier League," said Thaksin, a telecommunications
