
'86 women, children raped this month'

Grounded pilot to be sent to S'pore for medical

The Biman Bangladesh Airlines authorities yesterday decided to send a pilot grounded on health reasons to Singapore tomorrow for a medical check-up

He will be examined by International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO)-approved doctors in Singapore. If found fit, Biman will put him on the pilots' list and if not, he will remain grounded.

The decision was taken at a meeting between the authorities and the Biman Steering Committee, a platform of seven unions of Biman staff



Victim's husband lodged a case with Sirajganj police accusing three


