Bangla Bhag Holo (Translation of Bengal Divided by Joya Chatterji) Translation by Abu Zafar Edited by Bodiuddin Nazir

Price: Tk. 250.00 Previous studies of the Partition of India have concentrated on the negotiations of the transfer of power at the all-India level or have considered the emergence of separatist politics amongst India's Muslim minorities. This study provides a re-evaluation of the events of 1946-47 focusing on the political and social processes that led to the demand for partition in a Muslim-majority province, Bengal, and tracing the rise of Hindu communalism. In its most startling revelation, the author shows how the demand for a separate homeland for the Hindus, which was fuelled by a large and powerful section of Hindu society within Bengal, was seen as the only way to regain heir influence. The picture which emerges s one of a stratified and fragmented society moving away from the mainstream of Indian nationalism, and increasingly preoccupied with narrower, more parochial concerns.






Making of a Nation Bangladesh: An Economist's Tale Nurul Islam




Advance to Contact A Soldier's Account of Bangladesh Libera tion War Major (Retd) Akhtar Ahmed






