Diarrhoea claims 8 in Mymensingh

Diarrhoea has claimed at least eight lives in two upazilas of the district. A total of 824 diarrhoea patients

were admitted to different hospitals in the district in seven days till Sunday, according to the Civil Surgeon's office here vesterday.

Of the deaths, four were in in Mridha Para village in Sadar upazila. They are Anwara, 4, daughter of Avna Miah; nine-month-old Khodeja, daughter of Suta Begum; Rozina, 11, daughter Ajamat Ali, Obaidur Rahman, son of Momtzuddin.

Four others include three children of a family in Mailora village in

Rozina, 9, and Ruma, 3, son and daughters of Giasuddin. The identity of the other victim could be known Of those attacked with the disease,

338 were in Phulpur upazila, 100 in Trishal, 88 in Iswarganj, 65 in the Sadar, 67 in Haluaght, 66 in Gouripur, 46 in Phulbaria, 41 in Muktagacha and nine in Gafargoan upazila.
