No step taken yet to send ailing Nirmal Sen abroad

No step has yet been taken to send ailing Nirmal Sen, a veteran politician and journalist, overseas for treatment although two medical boards recommended better treatment for him abroad.

Nirmal Sen, 76, suffered a brain stroke on October 11, leaving him paralysed down his left side and unable to see, talk and eat. His condition has not improved in the past three weeks, doctors said.

He is now undergoing treatment at the Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University Hospital.

He was admitted to jail hospital the same day. Later, Kanchon was rushed to Chittagong Medical College Hospital where the on-duty doctors declared him dead in the early hours of

Earlier, Kanchon's wife Gulzer Begum alleged that police arrested her husband and beat up him mercilessly.

When the body was returned it was bruised all over with blood coming out from the ears and mouth. His left eye was also seriously damaged, she

Inadequate relief, diarrhoea cripple people in N-region

Khetmajur Samity leaders say

The lives of the people in the northern region where a famine-like situation has been prevailing are under threat, Bangladesh Khetmajur Samity leaders said yesterday after a visit to the

The monga (famine-like situation) and outbreak of diarrhoea have left over 1,000 people dead and triggered a mass migration of starving people, they said at a press conference in the

The seasonal monga has assumed its extreme form in about 100 upazilas of Nilphamari, Rangpur, Gaibandha, Panchagarh, Thakurgaon, Dinajpur, Lalmonirhat, and Naogaon districts.

jobless for long and they are passing their days in starvation as there is no food-for-work and test relief programmes, the leaders said.

"The food crisis in the region this year is acute," said the Samity General Secretary Saiful Huq.

According to media reports, more than 1,000 people died of starvation and diarrhoea in the northern districts in the past three months -- Bhadra, Ashwin, and Kartik, said the leaders.

Hundreds of people are being affected with diarrhoea everyday as they are forced to take inedible food day after day, they said. "The people are too poor to afford

even an oral saline to cure diarrhoea, Saiful Huq said while reading out a written statement. "Men, women and children are

To cope with the situation, the labourers are selling their labour in advance at Tk 25 to 30 per day instead of usual Tk 70 to 80 and the farmers are selling their paddy harvest in advance at a rate of Tk 150 to 180 per mound

when the market price is Tk 250 to 300. "More than 50 per cent students of my school have been suffering from starvation," said Samity Vice-President Anwar Hossain quoting Mamtai Uddin, a teacher of Jhunagachha Safani Dimukhi High School in Dimla Upazila of Nilphamari.

"During the visit, we came across a gathering of about 300 people at Kanchipara, Gaibandha, who were waiting for the UP chairman in the hope of getting some food," said Shiblul Bari, a leader of the Samity.

The leaders criticised the government for not taking adequate relief programmes for the affected people.

The Vulnerable Group Feeding (VGF) cards are also not being allocated as required, they said.

Some UNO officials and union parishad chairmen also blamed inadequate relief grants and local politicians' interference in relief distribution for the situation, the
