Saudi suicide blast kills 11

Over 120 injured in attack blamed on al-Qaeda

Saudi officials blamed al-Qaeda terrorists Sunday for a suicide car bombing that devastated a Riyadh housing complex, killing at least 11 people and wounding more than

Rubble, broken glass, splintered furniture and charred, twisted hunks of metal covered the scene of Saturday's attack, in which militants possibly disguised as police—shot their way into the compound in the upscale neighborhood before detonating at least one vehicle packed with explosives.

The attack was similar in style to a deadly suicide bombing of another Riyadh housing complex in May, also blamed on al-Qaeda.

The Saudi Interior Ministry said the 11 dead included Saudis, Lebanese, Sudanese and Egyptians, among them four children, the kingdom's official news agency said. The ministry said 122 were injured, but all but 25 had been discharged from hospitals by Sunday afternoon.

Among the dead were three Lebanese a woman, a 6-year-old boy and a 4-year-old girl and four Egyptians a couple and their two sons according to their countries' embassies in Riyadh.

The Interior Ministry said 86 people were wounded, mostly women and children. Most of the

Dhaka worried over unrest worldwide

Bangladesh yesterday expressed deep concern over waves of violence in Myanmar, Saudi Arabia and Iraq and recent political uncertainty in Sril anka.

Dhaka is watchful of the situation in Myanmar, which stemmed from clashes between Buddhist monks and Muslims, Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan told newspersons at a briefing on his recent visit from Germany.

The Myanmar government arrested many monks over the clashes and brought the situation under control, he said.

US soldier killed in Baghdad

A US soldier died and another was wounded in a bomb attack in Baghdad late Saturday, a military spokeswoman told AFP.

"One soldier was killed and another was wounded in an improvised explosive attack at 7:45 pm" in Baghdad's Waziriyah neighborhood, she said.

The death raised to 147 the number of US soldiers killed in combat in Iraq since May 1, when Washington declared major hostilities over.

Five seriously injured Shibir activists were admitted to Boyra Islami Bank Hospital.

Both student groups have

blamed each other for the "unprovoked" attack during a discussion on the occasion of National Revolution and Solidarity Day at the college auditorium yesterday.

The clash resulted from a dispute over the list of speakers at the meeting and scat arrangement for the Chhatra Dal and Shibir leaders. After a heated exchange of words, the two groups came to blows following which a group of JCD activists pelted brick.

Outlaws gun down Rajshahi BNP leader

Underground operatives gunned down a district leader of the ruling BNP in an attack that also left two of his relatives injured at Ghospara in Rajshahi city yesterday evening, police and witnesses said.

Abdul Hamid, 52, vice-president of the district BNP, took five bullets in his chest, abdomen and head and fell down before an operative slit his throat at about 6:00pm in a desperate bid to confirm his death.

Police arrested the Jhikra Union
Parishad (UP) chairman, MA Majid
after the incident that sparked

outrage among locals.

An unidentified outlaw of the Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP), blamed for a series of killings in south and southwestern districts, called a Rajshahi journalist and claimed the responsibility for the killing.

Opposition beefs up oust-govt campaign

This winter is warming up with the renewed permutation and combination among the political parties wanting to see an early exit of the government.

The Awami League's recent call for an early quitting of the BNP-led alliance government by April next year, much ahead of the five-year tenure, triggered immediate polarisation in the opposition political camp.

In an apparent run-up to a greater unified movement against the government, three left-leaning political parties joined hands with the main opposition for a show-downin January.

A coordination committee of AL, Hasanul Haq Inu-led Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD), Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) and the Workers Party (WP) met at the latter's office yesterday to chalk out the combined programme.

As a starter, these four parties

have planned to hold a national convention in early January to vent public wrath against, what the organisers dubbed, marginalisation of the Union Parishad by pitting it

against the Gram Sarkar.

AL and its newly found friends in the left-block yesterday finalised a schedule for holding greater preparatory meeting next month so that the convention could be convened in early January.

On December 19 representatives of the Union Parishads from across the country would join leaders of AL, JSD (Inu), CPB and WP in the city to finalise the convention schedule and the oust-government

Opposition leader Sheikh Hasina, JSD leader Hasanul Haq Inu, CPB leaders Monjurul Ahsan Khan and Mujahidul Islam Selim and WP leader Rashed Khan Menon would join the January convention, which many consider would be a turning point in the current spate of dis






