Chess superstar Garry Kasparov on Thursday lost his second virtual reality game against the computer "X3D Fritz," after agreeing to a draw with the machine in their first match. The computer, playing whites,

defeated Kasparov in 39 moves in a match that lasted four hours.

A slip by the former world champion in movement 32 resulted in a blistering attack from the computer. forcing two checks before Kasparov conceded.

The 40-year-old Russian-American will play two more games against "X3D Fritz" at the New York Athletic Club

Kasparov played wearing 3-D glasses, gazing at a chess board that appears to float in the air. He dictated piece movements with voice commands, and rotated the board with a joystick.

The International Computer Games Association and the United States Chess Federation will be holding the next games on November 16 and 18 at the New York Athletic Club.

Kasparov is considered the world's Queensland's first innings of 605 for best chess player, even though he lost seven declared against Victoria on the world champion title to Vladimir Kramnik in 2000

Test with only eight and two, stubbornly created his personal milestone and he went on to score 118 before he fell to Omari Banks. He was the spinner's only wicket of the day, for a cost of more than 100 runs.

He hit 14 boundaries and took Zimbabwe past their first objective, which was to avoid the follow-on.



Don's lost cap put on display

Australian cricket legend Don Bradman's first baggy green cap, thought to be lost for more than 60 years, went on public display Friday following its chance discovery.

The cap was given to Bradman when he made his Test debut against England in Brisbane in 1928 but went missing in the 1930s after Bradman gave it to the schoolboy son of a family friend

South Australia state library director Sue Lear said the cap was discovered in Adelaide home earlier this year, where it had been kept by its owner, who did not realise its significance.

"This cap was given to a schoolboy family friend of the Bradmans, Peter Dunham, who until recently didn't ealise the cap he used to wear while plaving backvard cricket was such a significant part of Australian cricket history," Lear said. The cap has been put on display in the ibrary's Bradman Collection, along with another Bradman wore in 1934.

One of his baggy green caps sold for 425,000 dollars (306,000 US) earlier this year

Sachin Tendulkar says India will need to match Australia's aggressive approach if they are not to be swept away again during their away test series starting later this month.

"It is going to be very challenging for me as well as the whole team," he told The Hindu newspaper on Friday.

"You've got to be bold enough to face challenges over there. Take them head on.'

India leave for Australia next Friday to play four tests and a one-day triseries against the world champions. India lost a test series 4-0 in Australia in 1991-92, and 3-0 in 1999-00.

They caused a shock two years ago, however, by coming back to beat Australia 2-1 at home, with captain

New Zealand have a penchant for ruining the hosts' party. Last year, they stopped Australia from qualifying for the final of their own tri-series.

Then in May this year, the Kiwis kept Sri Lanka out of the final of the triangular that also featured Pakistan.

New Zealand have not lost a match to India on the current tour, having drawn both Test matches before winning one tri-series match against the hosts at Cuttack while the other at Madras was rained off.

Fleming admitted his injury and the uncertainity of the Pakistan tour -- a final decision on the trip was unlikey to be made before Monday - had left his team feeling uneasy.

"There's a lot of emotion and feeling floating around," he said. "I certainly want to lead the players in whichever direction we're asked to go. "I've had a couple of sleepless

nights."

The Indians, struggling for form with both bat and ball, will be inspired by their previous clash against New Zealand at this venue when Tendulkar smashed 186 and Rahul Dravid hit 153

NZ to assess Pak tour

New Zealand Cricket officials said Friday they will decide by Monday at the latest whether the tour of Pakistan will go ahead this month after threats were made against the players if the series proceeds.

Full details of the threat have not been released but New Zealand Cricket (NZC) chief executive Martin Snedden said it was "very direct -- it is explicit about the Black Caps in Pakistan and a warning not to go.

The email message "certainly threatened consequences if the team were to

ignore the warning". However, four players and an official who decided not to tour had withdrawn before the threat was received earlier this week.

Craig McMillan, Scott Styris, Lou Vincent, Ian Butler and team video analyst Zach Hitchcock made themselves unavailable because of trauma from witnessing a fatal bomb blast in Karachi during New Zealand's tour of Pakistan last year.

Heath Mills, manager of New Zealand Players Association, said members of the New Zealand team currently playing in India were "definitely shaken" by the threat, but he could not say if more players would refuse to go to Pakistan.
