3 cars stolen in as many days


Some organised gangs are now active in stealing private cars from crowded areas of the city, now gripped in Eidshopping spree.

At least three private cars were stolen during the last three days, car

Police said one white-coloured private car (Dhaka-Metro-Ga-115294) was stolen from Dhanmondi area vesterday when the owner of the vehicle was attending Juma prayers after some shopping.

Selim Ahmed, the owner of the car, has filed a case with the local

Another maroon-coloured private car (Dhaka-Metro-Kha-1113919) was



stolen at vesterday noon from the premises of Rapa Plaza, a busy shopping mall in the city where a number of law-enforcers were active.

On Thursday, another private car was stolen from the city's Mohammadpur area.

Organised gangs are involved in such incidents and they are very careful and clever," said one police officer on duty.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police Commissioner Ashraful Huda told BSS that they had taken adequate measures to maintain law and order in the city during the holy month of Ramadan and Eid-shopping.

Side by side with the lawenforcers, the people should also be more careful while parking their vehicles, he added

Huda said the owners of shops and markets should also step up their own security to check incidents of stealing.

The government strengthened the security measures in the capital since the beginning of the Ramadan by deploying 7,000 law-enforcers including 450 members of the armed police battalion, 440 personnel of Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and 100 members of Ansar.

Forty-one teams of strike forces, each comprising 10 BDR personnel and four policemen, are operating in different areas to check crimes while 10 to 20 policemen are deployed at each market for the security of traders

to make patients aware that they are at great risk," said an expert

The lung experts also discussed the new approach to tackle the low rates of

diagnosis in COPD. It is estimated that up to 50 percent of people with the disease worldwide

go undiagnosed. Hundreds of millions of people struggle with the effects of COPD on a daily basis but it remains among the most under-diagnosed and under treated of the world's major killers, said

The COPD is a devastating lung disease and according to a WHO estimate the disease kills about 2.75 million people each year.

It ranks worldwide as the fourth leading cause of death alongside HIV/AIDS.
