The right knee of Mashrafee-bin-Mortuza was successfully operated

upon by Dr. David Young at the Avenue Hospital in Melbourne on Monday. The 20-year-old Narail speedster,

who tore his right knee ligament while bowling against England in the second Test in Chittagong last month, went through two MRIs in Chittagong and Dhaka before he was sent down under on the advice of Dr Young.

The Australian surgeon had recently treated injured pacer Mohammad Sharif's groin at the same hospital.

Talking to The Daily Star Sport yesterday, Bangladesh coach Dav Whatmore said that Mashrafee was alright after the first operation and if everything was satisfactory then the left knee would also undergo surgery after two weeks.

The right-arm paceman is expected to be out of action for up to eight months. Meanwhile, Sharif returned home

on Friday. He will now spend 16 weeks in a rehabilitation programme.

Australia Test captain Steve Waugh announced on Wednesday he will retire from international cricket at the end of the upcoming home series with India.

Waugh told a hastily arranged news conference at the Sydney Cricket Ground that he would call it guits after the fourth Test with India, starting in Sydney on January 2.

"The upcoming Sydney test will be my last for Australia, should I be selected to play," Waugh said. "My present form and fitness

He is also the most successful captain in Test cricket and is second on the all-time list of century makers with 32

Waugh, 38, had previously planned to retire after Australia's tour of India in September next year but decided to bring it forward after consulting his family

"I want to leave the game on a high and I feel the time is right now," Waugh

Waugh is the most capped player in the sport's history with 164 Test Waugh made his Test debut against India in 1985 and has climbed every appearances and the second highest mountain in the game, including run scorer with 10.660 runs.

captaining Australia to victory in the one-day 1999 World Cup. He inherited a struggling team and

turned them into one of the greatest sides cricket has seen with his own skill and fierce determination.

But as the years went on, he began facing increasing pressure from the national selectors and local media to hang up his bat and give a younger player a chance.

His career seemed to be on the rocks after a barren run last year, but he defied the critics with a stunning century in the final Ashes Test against England in January, hitting a boundary off the final ball of the day to reach his hundred.

That innings not only silenced his doubters but also seemed to revitalise Waugh who has scored another four centuries since then and is arguably in the best form of his career.

"I'll never forget what happened in Sydney, no-one will ever take that away," Waugh said.

"There was a temptation to finish up then but it wasn't about that one good moment. I wanted to go when I was playing well and playing consistently.

"I feel I'm playing consistently and I'm in good form now and I wanted to go when there was still some fire in the belly.'

Waugh was dropped from the Australian Test team in 1990-91 to allow his twin brother Mark to make his debut, but remodelled his game, putting the hook shot away and adopting a more controlled approach, to become one of the prized wickets of world cricket.He never looked back afteı that a n d SEE PAGE 14 COL 8

Former South Africa captain Kepler Wessels was found not guilty of racism on Wednesday by a disciplinary tribunal of the Eastern Province Cricket Union where he is coach.

"Kepler had the hearing yesterday and the judgement was made this afternoon -- he was found not guilty," EPCU chief executive officer David Emslie said.

"We are awaiting the full judgement papers but we know he has been found not guilty.'

Wessels was accused by two black players in his squad of calling them "animals" at a net practice on October 23 but he always vehemently denied the claim.

The Bangladesh A team's participation in the Inter-departmental Cricket Championship (Patron's Trophy and Patron's Cup) has been deferred for at least ten days following Pakistan Cricket Board's decision to increase the number of teams from nine to 13.

The PCB took the decision on November 26 at the request of some leading local teams who had originally failed to qualify for the first-class competition.

Initially, the PCB decided to pick the two top teams from each of the four groups of the qualifying round that concluded on November 22. Now, nowever, they have decided to promote the top three teams and make it a 13team event with Bangladesh A.

Accordingly, thirteen teams have
