Mokhlesur Rahman murder Wife demands arrest of accused

Family members of the leading aviation businessman Mokhlesur Rahman, who was shot dead in the city in broad day light on October 6, have demanded immediate arrest of Abdul Matin Chowdhury, an accused in the murder case.

In a written statement, Nazma Rahman, wife of the deceased, alleged that Matin Chowdhury had been moving in the area for last one week along with some armed cadres in a private car.

She said they are afraid of the dubious movement of Matin Chowdhury who has a long record of criminal activities and he should be interrogated

Police arrested two people in connection with the murder of one Sohel Molla, 25, over a land dispute at Karnakati village of Sadar upazila under Barisal district on Friday.

Two other persons Chunnu, 20, and Khokan (35) were also injured seriously in the incident.

The arrested are Atiqur Rahman, 26, and Mosharraf Hossain, 60. Earlier, Selim Howlader, brother-

in-law of Sohel lodged a case with Kotwali police station on Friday night accusing 15 persons in this connection.

Police said there were old disputes between Selim Howlader and Khokan Howlader over 34 acres of land.

Recently Selim won a case related to the disputed land and this infurated the opponent who planned to take Under this situation, Sohel, his

Qulkhwani Khokan went there to visit the house of Selim on Friday morning.

The opponent group abducted Sohel, Chunnu and Khokan and chopped them and cut the tendons of their legs and hands.

Local people rushed them to Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College Hospital where Sohel succumbed to his injuries in the afternoon. The condition of Chunnu and
