A storehouse of a rubber factory was gutted in a fire at Postogola in the city in the early hours of yesterday. STAFF

The fire broke out at the Nippon Rubber Factory at around 1.45am.

Firefighters from Postogola, S a d a r g h a t a n d R a m n a Headquarters unit rushed to the spot and brought the blaze under control after over one and a half hours.

It was not known how the fire started. However, there was no report of casualties.

The loss in the fire was estimated at about Tk 7 lakh, said the factory owners.

BNP leader Sirajul Islam, a former MP, died of cancer at his residence at Chandgaon in the city yesterday at the age of 68. He is survived by his wife and


five sons. Sirajul Islam was elected a member of parliament from Chittagong-10 constituency twice in 1979 and 1991, said a press release.

One to die for killing wife

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced one person to death for killing his wife at Keraniganj in April 2001.

The Judge Shamsul Haq of the Seventh Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court, Dhaka gave the verdict at 1:00am at a crowded courtroom in presence of the victim's husband Salimullah alias Jewel.

The judge said the convict can appeal to the High Court against the judgement within seven days.

n After hearing the verdict, a g Salimullah remained calm in the d dock.

The prosecution story in brief is that Salimullah killed his wife Sabina Akhter following a family feud at their rented house at Rasulpur under Keraniganj thana on April 22, 2001. Later, he contained the body of Sabina in a cartoon and dumped it at Agasadek Lane at Pakistan Math in the city. The following day Kotwali Police recovered the body from the stair of second floor of a house at 100 Agasadek Lane and sent it to the Mitford Hospital for autopsy.

Later, victim's elder sister Nargis Akhter filed a murder case with Keraniganj thana accusing Salimullah the same day.

The Investigation Officer of the case submitted charge sheet against Salimullah on June 6, last year. The court framed charges against him on March 18.
