Ushering in mambo, samba and more

Kamrul Islam Nadeem speaks about contemporary western dance, sitting at the Russian Cultural Centre

FAYZA HAQ

The Daily Star: How did you get to know the various types of contemporary dances so that you are well equipped today to conduct classes yourself at the Russian Cultural

Kamrul Islam Nadeem: I've been dancing on stage from my childhood: it's my hobby since my early days, along with painting and music. The school which I went to at New Delhi taught these formal western dances as a part of the curriculum. When I'd moved away from India, when I was in class VIÍ, I'd been taught the aesthetic of dance along with yoga and gymnastics to develop the required stamina for dance. Dancing deals with physical motion for which you have to have a musical sense. Without a sense of rhythm and music you cannot dance satisfactorily: you might be able to swivel your hips and gyrate your body, as they do on the dance floors occasionally in Dhaka, but that is not

You must master rhythm to follow the teacher's steps; timing of beats must be kept in mind. Just following mentally is not adequate: there must be physical learning. In order to maintain the physical balance, which is prerequisite to dancing, body fitness and concentration are necessary. Control of breathing and body flexibility to bring in fluidity and spontaneity in your movements concentration are necessary. Whether you go in for folk or ballet your rhythmic sense and body shape play important roles. First the student masters certain basic steps and mind as well as body control and then moves on to decide what kind of dances he/she will opt for.

Apart from the sense of rhythm, there must also be a basic aesthetic sensibility in the student's mind. This sense of proportion comes from fine arts: he/she must be aware in his/her mind of the length of the steps and the accompanying body movements and hand positions. Facial expressions and eye-contacts must be mastered too. Even the accompanying smile should be measured and yet natural. The dance sequences depend gladly accepted by the audience. Both western and eastern formal dances are based on theoretical sense and practice naturally makes the student perfect. The space in practice as long as his body can bear it and he has the time and

TDS: What were the dances that

When I came to Dhaka in 1986 I found no educational institution at that time which taught contemporary dance along with other academic education. I continued through practice of my own, and study through illustrated books and sections of magazines. Thus my practice of dance had continued through self-teaching. When I began my Intermediate studies, I had pure science background, but at the same time I wanted to do

western musical instrument. We were also introduced to the history of eastern music: we were taught the basics of 'guru shikhha'. The specialization obviously followed later. From this the student could branch out to any level, given the proper guidance and encouragement. There were lots of inter city there after selection and this gave us great impetus. Nasirul Haq Khokon has won the Zakaria Smrity Padak introduced by *Theatre* recently. Every year *Theatre* honours two drama personalities for their remarkable achievements by giving them Shahid Muneir Chaudhury Padak and Zakaria Smrity Padak. Nasirul Haq Khokon is the second backstage worker who has won this prestigious award. Before him another prominent light designer of country Thandu Rayhan of Aranyak won this award. It was an excellent experience for this young and talented designer of Nagarik *Natya Sampradaya*. To express his feelings, the master of light designing of the country says, "It was really a surprise for me to receive the award from the renowned intellectual of the country Mustafa Nurul Islam. I felt proud to receive the award along with Selim Al Deen, one of the best playwrights of the present time. The Tk.15,000 award may not be much to many, but the medal is valuable for me. think, it is good news for the back-stage workers of the country that their works are also being recog-

Nasirul Haq Khokon started his theatre work as a regular worker of Nagarik Natya Sampradaya in 1985. Like other newcomers, he had also cherished the idea of becoming a good actor. He had performed in some of the productions at his early theatre career. Later he found interest in light designing. He says, 'I consider light designing more exciting than painting. Because in the case of light-design, I can create many aesthetic arts on a huge live canvas simultaneously by changing the angles, intensity and colour of lights. On the contrary the painters can create one single piece on one canvas. Moreover, we can express the inner feelings of the artistes through symbolic colour effects. In this sense, we the light designers, are not totally detached from the

Professionally a businessman, Nasirul Haq Khokon has no academic knowledge in light-design but he has taken part in many workshops under many renowned light designers of the world like apas Sen, Simon Corder, Kurt Harminson and S. Dublin jointly arranged by the British Council and other institutes. He thinks in theatre practical application is more important than theoretical knowledge. Thus if a person goes through many books related to that he gets for his work.

He thinks that the designers should get more recognition and says, "A better future is ahead for the designers as they can work with the exterior designers and can make money. I am now working with some internationally recognized architects to beautify the historical building- *Lalbagh Kella*. I think that the government should

designing he/she may acquire theoretical knowledge but will never be able to give lay out of a suitable design unless he/she gets a scope to share thoughts with a recognized designer. That scope is offered in the workshops.

In our country, the designers were neglected during the primary stage but time is changing now. Everybody in the drama lane now realizes the importance of a symbolic set and synchronized lights to express the theme of a play. That is why the renowned designers are working with many groups. Nasirul Haq Khokon is working with Nagarik Natya Sampradaya as a regular worker but at the same time he is working with several other groups of the country as a guest worker. The remuneration that he gets is not remarkable but he is very happy with the respect and love
