## Apollo Hospital to be set up in Dhaka

Setting up of an unit of Apollo Hospitals Group of Kolkata in Dhaka is underway at a cost of Tk 200 crore to provide most modern treatment facilities to Bangladeshi patients.

This was stated by V Satyanarayana Reddy, chief execu-tive officer of the hospital at a press conference at a city hotel yesterday.

He said the unit would start functioning with the import of necessary medical equipment within the next three to six months. It will be housed at a building in Baridhara, he added.
