The Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolis (CCDM) is planning to bring some changes in the upcoming Premier Division Cricket League format to make it more competitive.

The CCDM met 12 club officials yesterday where national coach Dav Whatmore, Under-19 coach Richard McInnes and BCB chief executive officer Macky Dudhia were also present.

"We are thinking to divide the teams into two groups where the two top teams from each group will play in the semifinals but everything will depend on the partici-pating clubs. We will meet again next Saturday to take a decision, said CCDM chairman Khandakar Jamil Uddin last night.

But he said that the league would be a two-day 90-over affair.

The most exciting domestic competition is likely to start from March 1. Before that the three-day inter-club players' transfer will start from December 27.

India needed only one delivery to mop up Australia's first innings on Saturday before heavy rain washed out their chances of making a significant reply in the first Test at the Gabba the Gabba. Australia finished with a first

innings total of 323 after their worst batting collapse on home soil in a decade. India were 11 without loss when more showers forced play to be abandoned early on the third day.

Only 38 balls were bowled after the start delayed for six hours.

Less than 85 overs have been completed in the first three days. The umpires will try to make up some of the lost time on the final two days.

Djibril Cisse, the most exciting French striker in Ligue 1, will almost certainly miss Euro 2004 after being banned for five matches for kicking an opponent in an under-21 international against Portugal

The French and Portuguese federations were each fined 6,400 euros (\$7,700) for the behaviour of their players and the Portuguese have been ordered to pay for the damage caused to their dressing room in Clermont-Ferrand.

The ban counts only for official matches, not friendlies, and will therefore start at Euro 2004. AJ Auxerre's Cisse, the top scorer in Ligue 1, would only be available for the final if France got that far.

"France forward Cisse was sent off for deliberately kicking an opponent," UEFA said in a statement.

"The player then did not leave the pitch immediately, protesting and insulting the referee as well as acting aggressively towards Portuguese players.

France coach Jacques Santini said he was stunned by the ban. "No decision will be made until all Everything went according to plan in the first leg of the playoff in Guimaraes with Cisse scoring the

goals in a 2-1 French win. He also scored in the second leg but was sent off shortly before halftime. Portugal won the tie on a pen-

alty shoot-out. Another French player, Gael Givet, was banned for wo matches for his attitude towards the referee at the end of the second leg.

Cisse, tall, powerful and almost as fast as Henry, is leading the goalscorers' list in France with 12 goals in 16 games. He has 16 caps and was in the France 2002 World Cup squad, coming on three times as a substitute.

Henry and Trezeguet are proba-bly the best striking pair in European soccer but they failed to fire in 2002 when France were knocked out in the first round. With the system favoured by Santini, they have few direct replacements apart from Cisse.

Sydney Govou of Olympique Lyon is the next best thing but he does not scare defenders like the shock-haired Auxerre player and is not as natural a goalscorer. Manchester City's Nicolas Anelka would fit the bill but his

relationship with Santini is glacial The manager said in August Anelka was France's "most ineligible' player for Euro 2004.

Middlesbrough midfielder Gaizka Mendieta has set his sights on a recall to the Spanish national side for the Euro 2004 finals after rediscovering his best form in the Premier League.

The 29-year-old former Valencia player, who played in last year's World Cup finals and has been capped 40 times, says Spain's bid for success in Portugal would be strengthened by the inclusion of players with experience of international tournaments.

"The Spanish team always has very good players and now it is a

young team and they have already showed that they can do well at Euro 2004 but it is important that there is also experience of that sort of com-

petition in the squad," Mendieta told reporters on Friday. "I would like to be involved in Euro 2004 which is a very important competition that every player wants to be involved in but for the moment am just worrying about Middlesbrough.

"If I play well for Middlesbrough and give them what they want, which is a place in Europe, then the national team will come. If not, it is not a problem.

Mendieta joined Middlesbrough, who host Portsmouth in the league on Saturday, in August initially on a one-year loan from Italian side Lazio

but has already agreed to stay on at the Riverside for a further four years.

He has scored two goals in 10 appearances for Boro this season and says he feels revitalized after a disappointing spell in Serie A.

"I've settled in here because of the club and the team and also because the way football is played in the Premiership is pretty similar to the Primera Liga so it makes it easier to adapt for players who come from Spain," Mendieta added.

"The English game allows me the time to do what I do best because the games are very open. You get the chance to get the ball and play football and if you are patient you can find the space to play and try to do things.
