A construction firm has decamped with Tk 26.7 crore of the Roads and Highways Department (R&H) abandoning two road reconstruction projects in Barisal.

R&H sources here said a Bagladeshi company was given work order on July 5, 2000 for reconstruc-tion of 17-KM Dhawa-Ikri road in Vandaria upazila in Pirojpur district with an estimated cost of 26.4 core. The project was scheduled to be completed within 24 months.

The time was extended by 17 months but the work was not completed.
