187 bank branches to accept utility bills

The residents of Dhaka will be able to pay all utility bills to 187 select branches of private or public sector banks.

They will also be able to pay the bills online -- through ATM and credit cards and other electronic systems accepted to the banks

The finance ministry yesterday approved the proposal for the payment of telephone, electricity, gas, water and other bills at the select branches in Dhaka and Tongi considering people's incon-

venience in clearing the bills. The finance ministry and different bank management will meet soon to select the branches zone-wise where the service will

belaunched. Directives to the banks will be sent soon.

The ministry also decided that the system would be replicated in

other metropolitan cities in near future Under the arrangement, banks will not be given any service charge, but be allowed to keep the deposits for a certain period.

Presently some bank branches accept telephone bills, some electricity or water, requiring an individual to go to four separate branches a month and wait in long queues for hours.

The cabinet in September decided to introduce a One Stop Utility Bill Payment System.

It then decided to introduce the system in nationalised commercial banks only, but Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman met different bank management to spread the service to private banks also.
