West Indian captain Brian Lara completed his sixth Test double century but it was not enough to prevent South Africa from moving into a strong position on the fourth day of the first Test at the Wanderers

South Africa were 88 for one in their second innings at tea, an overall

Lara made 202 before he was ninth out in a West Indian first innings total of 410.

South African captain Graeme Smith made 44 as his side increased their 151-run advantage on the first innings.

He was the only man dismissed,

although Herschelle Gibbs, his opening partner, had to retire hurt on six with a broken nose after missing a hook against Vasbert Drakes. Lara, resuming on 178, saw

Mervyn Dillon and Chris Gayle dismissed before he lashed Nel through the covers for four to raise

Gayle, normally an opening batsman, batted at number nine for a torn left hamstring.

In making his sixth Test double century, Lara joined Javed Miandad of Pakistan in third place on the alltime list of double centurions. Don Bradman of Australia made 12 and Wally Hammond of England seven.
