The Institute of Business Administration (IBA) was established in 1966 under the University of Dhaka to cater the need of executives in the field of business, commerce, industry and other areas of economy. Through the establishment of the institute, business education got the legitimate stature & recognition as an important academic discipline in Bangladesh. Since the inception of IBA, MBA program has been playing a pioneer role in country to provide efficient entrepreneurs and executives to the nation. The nation has passed about 33 years of her independence, but still we are lagging behind the desired level of economic development. I think one of the most important reasons behind this is the failure of our policy makers to recognize management as a separate discipline. This unfortunate nation is still passing through a serious crisis of business leaders. IBA as meer institute is playing a vital role to meet up this crisis of business leaders.

In MBA program we offer courses in two streams-full time and part time. To complete MBA degree in full time, it will require two years time & part time will require three & half years time.
