Dharla Bi UNB, Dhaka The Dharla Bridge, country's first locally financed bridge, will open to traffic today, fulfilling a century-old demand of the people of four upazilas in Kurigram district. Prime Minister Khaleda Zia will formally inaugurate the bridge, built at a cost of about Tk 100 crore.	Official sources in Kurigram saic the inauguration of the bridge will bring some 700,000 people of Sadar Bhurungamari, Nageswari and Fulbar upazilas under direct road communicationnetwork. The 648-metre-long bridge has two lanes with 1,25-metre wide footpaths on both sides. It has 15 spans, 16 pillars and 6.4-metre approach road. The initiative to construct the	bridge over Dharla was taken by Pri Minister Khaleda Ziain 1995-96. And the then prime minister She Hasina laid the foundation stone of bridge on February 24, 2000. The Al-Amin Constructed Company Limited constructed bridge according to a design prepa by Bangladesh University Engineering and Technology.
