## **Bol survey gives lopsided FDI** picture

## Only inflow data counted, not outflow figure, says MCCI

#### **STAFF CORRESPONDENT**

The recent Board of Investment (BoI) survey on foreign direct investment (FDI) presents a lopsided picture of the subject as a result of a faulty survey method, including inadequate coverage, says the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI).

The BoI survey report gives only inflow data, excluding outflow, and hence net FDI figures are not available in it. So is the case with private debts, the chamber points out.

## "In order to get a fuller picture,

one needs to know the stock of FDI at a particular point of time, which is not available in the BoI survey report," the MCCI observes in the latest issue of its monthly publication, the Chamber News.

The chamber thinks the questionnaire used in the BoI survey was too concise and did not ask for any information on possible outflows -- repatriation of capital or profit or payment of interests on private debts.
