

# DOHS down Abahani too

Three days after their thrilling three-run victory over Mohammedan Sporting Club, defending

champions Old DOHS pulled off yet another nervy nine-run win against proven giants Abahani Krira Chakra in the Aktel Premier Division Cricket League yesterday.

It was DOHS's third consecutive hard-fought win to secure maximum 16 points, two points ahead of second-placed Victoria Sporting Club who handed a 85-run defeat on Agrani Bank to confirm the Super Six berth along with the holders.

The match at the BKSP was almost a replay of their Friday's thriller at Fatullah, and interestingly DOHS set a demanding 249 for Abahani to win -- one run more than they had thrown at Mohammedan to chase.

Although many felt it was like a mountain to climb for Abahani, especially after their poor run of form with a mediocre set up, the popular Dhanmondi outfit showed the spirit and fight they are famous for and almost chased down the target reaching 239, their highest innings total in the League.

But in a match of lot of similarities with the one of Friday's, Khaled Mahmud stopped the surprise Abahani surge dismissing the last two batsmen in the penultimate over with Abahani needing 14 runs from the final 12 deliveries.

The former national captain also took two wickets in the nail biting last over against Mohammedan after national wicketkeeper Khaled Mashud had tilted the balance, hitting the first ball for a massive six.

On Monday, Anwar Hossain Munir dispatched Mahmud's first delivery for a four. But the 'fighter' gave a fitting reply by uprooting the stumps of Munir and Ishtiaq Siddiqi in the next two deliveries.

# Kallis, Prince steady SA

South Africans Jacques Kallis and Ashwell Prince blunted Australia's bowlers with a record century stand after the home team's early success, supporting skipper Graeme Smith's decision to bat in the final cricket Test Monday.

After losing the wickets of AB de Villiers (2), Herschelle Gibbs (27) and Smith (39) in the first session, the Proteas, trailing 1-0 in the series, ground out three runs an over to build a solid first innings

The entire morning session at the Sydney Cricket Ground was lost to rain after a New Year's Day scorcher before Smith opted to bat first on a greenish pitch under cloudy skies conducive to swing bowling.

At stumps on a slow-moving opening day, South Africa were 230 for three, with Kallis on 80 and in sight of his 23rd Test century and

Kallis, who was Test cricket's top-ranked batsman before being
