Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon was fighting for his life yesterday after suffering a massive brain haemorrhage, throwing the coun-try into turmoil less than three months before a general election.

The 77-year-old Sharon, dubbed "the Bulldozer," underwent seven hours of surgery before doctors were able to halt bleeding in his brain but the prime minister remained in a critical condition.


