Single legislation for all public universities

University Grants Commission (UGC) has prepared a 20-year strategic plan for higher education that aims to discourage direct involvement of the university teachers and students with party politics, developing a single legisla tion for all public universities, and increasing the universities' inter-

The UGC plan titled 'Strategic Plan for Higher Education in Bangladesh: 2005-2025' is supposed to be submitted to the prime

minister in the next week, the UGC

While the plan is to undergo a graduated process of implementation over four phases in 20 years, most policy issues including urgent reforms are concentrated in the immediate phase.

It also proposes setting up 22 more public universities in 20 years to meet the growing demand for nigher education.

The strategy plan's immediate phase from 2006 to 2007 includes review of legislation for both public and private universities, enactment of umbrella legislation for public universities, setting up an Accreditation Council, restructuring UGC, operationalising all the universities for which laws have been passed, improving logistic support for teaching, developing curricula to address PRSP, restructuring the National University (NU), initiating action for setting up six regional operation centres of the NU in the divisional headquar-

APP removed for defending Mufti Hannan


An assistant public prosecutor (APP) was relieved of his post for defending Mufti Abdul Hannan, the operations commander of the banned Harkatul-Jihad (HuJi), in connection with an August 17 bomb blast case.

An order signed by deputy solicitor Syed Enayet Hossain of the Ministry of Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs relieved the APP, Emdadul Haque Lal, of the charge on Sunday.

The letter said the APP has been relieved of his responsibilities in public interest and that he has been directed to hand over the charge to the Metropolitan PP upon receiving it.

On January 4, APP Emdadul Haque along with two other lawyers submitted a petition with vokalatnama for conducting the case filed against Hannan in connection with the explosion on Kazi Nazrul Islam Avenue near Shahbagh on August 17. Shahbagh on August 17.

They prayed for cancellation of the remand saying the IO could not gather any clues to the August 17 blasts even though Hannan was in

More bird flu deaths as experts meet on crisis

Bird flu experts meeting in Beijing said yesterday the world urgently needed to amass a war chest to fight bird flu and prepare nations should a pandemic strain emerge.

Underscoring that urgency, Indonesia's health ministry said a toddler who died on Tuesday was being tested for bird flu days after his 13-year-old sister died of the H5N1 virus, according to local tests. A surviving sister is also being tested.

Cold claims 19 more lives in three districts

Biting cold and cold-related diseases claimed 19 more lives over the past 24 hours in Gaibandha, Thakurgaon and Kurigram dis-

Our Gaibandha correspondent reported that five more people died from shivering cold in the last two days and over three thousands people, mostly aged and children, in the remote shoal areas of the Brahmaputra basin are suffering from cold-related diseases.

The dead are Abdul Ghani Sarker, 70, of Hasanerpara of Palashbari upazila, Moifulnessa, 65, of Kalapani of Shaghata upazila, Kazem Akanda, 68, of Ulipur, Naimuddin, 75, and Asiropanese. Naimuddin, 75 and Asironnessa, 60, of Chawgharia of Gobindaganj



Dhaka to seek \$100m aid to fight bird flu

Bangladesh will seek more than \$100 million to help fight bird flu at a two-day international donors' conference in Beijing, a senior government official said yesterday.

"We are looking for over \$100 million in assistance to get pre-pared for any outbreak of avian influenza," Abdul Motalib, a director at the Department of Livestock, told the news agency.

The two-day conference, which started yesterday, aims to raise 1.5 billion to help prevent a potential bird flu pandemic.

"We have a team now in Beijing to attend the international conference and they will make the request to donors and development partners," he added.

Motalib, also a member of national bird flu taskforce, said despite a ban on poultry imports from 17 bird flu-affected nations, the country was not prepared to deal with an outbreak of the disease.
