ADP implementation slower by 5pc points

Despite a massive election-year boost in funding, the government's annual development programme (ADP) implementation in the first five months of this fiscal year is slower by five percentage points than last year's Fifteen ministries and depart-

ments, who receive 77 percent of the total ADP allocation, could spend only 23 percent of the funds in July-November period. The implementation rate was 28 percent in the same period of last fiscal year.

"Monsoon and procurement for various projects have delayed the implementation of the ADP, but we have found that the implementation rate has started to improve by December," Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman said vesterday.

By the end of December, the rate would be 33 percent, which is "not bad," the minister said after reviewing the ADP implementation of the 15 ministries at a meeting at the National Economic Council auditorium.


