Security has been beefed up in and around the stadium following the recovery of firearms, said Sadar Police Station OC Shahjahan.

The admission test for first year honours courses of 2005-2006 sessions at Chittagong University (CU) begins today.

The test for Gha unit (Social

Science Faculty) will be held today where around 24 admission seekers will vie for one seat.

A total of 66,257 candidates collected forms against 2,815 seats under different faculties this year which is around three thousand more than those of previous year.

However, with the introduction of two more departments Psychology and Persian Language- the number of units has also been raised to eight from previous seven, sources

Hundreds of admission seek-ers started arriving at the campus since yesterday to sit for the test and they are staying in the dormitories with their relatives

With the presence of the candidates, the dormitories, teastalls, restaurants and canteens are now crowded with people.

Photography album on SM Sultan launched

A photography album on renowned artist SM Sultan by noted photographer Nasir Ali Mamun was launched and the 50th solo exhibition of the photographer was inaugurated at the Drik gallery in the city yesterday.

Speaking at the ceremony, Mamun said he would set up a photography museum in the country with a view to displaying and preserving the portrait pho-tographs of the world famous personalities.

The album titled "Guru" by Mamun contains some rare and intimate moments of the life of artist SM Sultan that Mamun took staying with him for nine years from 1978 to 1987. During his stay in the abandoned royal palace in Narail where Sultan lived, Mamun observed his enigmatic lifestyle and took snaps of the

Describing Sultan as the 'wonder of east Bengal', Mamun said he considered Sultan as 'mysterious' as he saw him talking with animals and worms and he had intimacy with them.

'Uphold dignity of national flag, resist bomb attackers'

With a vow to uphold the dignity of the hard earned national flag by resisting the defeated forces of 1971, people from all walks of life joined the national flag procession at the Central Shaheed Minar in the city yesterday.

Under the banner of Bikkhubdha Deshbashi (aggrieved citizens), the common people spontaneously joined the procession with the slogan 'The defeated forces of 1971, the mastermind of recent bomb blasts, must be

Starting from the Central Shaheed Minar in the morning, the procession ended at the National Museum after passing through the Teachers Students Centre (TSC) and Milan Chattar on DU campus.

Earlier speakers at the Shaheed Minar said, taking the advantage of people's generosity and myopia of the ruling parties, the vested quar-ter who opposed the liberation of the country gained much strength and started fighting against the progressive forces to turn the country into a communal and fundamental one.

"They even threatened to elimi-nate the freedom fighters and undermine the spirit of our libera-tion war, said Zahirul Islam, an activist of Bikkhubdha Deshbashi,

while reading out a written speech. Similar processions were also brought out in Kishoreganj, Netrakona, Sirajganj and Narayanganj at the same time.

On December 14, Bikkhubdha Deshbashi announced a programme to hold national flag rocession on every Friday till March 26 to protect the dignity of the national flag and resist the defeated forces of 1971.

A grand national flag procession will be brought out in Dhaka on March 25.
