# Sonargaon smite DOHS

Sonargaon Cricketers came out with all guns blazing to

wicked twist in the title race with an emphatic six-wicket win over runaway leaders Old DOHS in the Aktel Premier Division Cricket League at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium yester-

day.
Akram Khan-led DOHS went into their second Super-Six match against a big-spending Sonargaon to repeat their feat in the first phase and take an unassailable lead in their hot pursuit for a second successive title. But the holders came unstuck against an assault from Sonargaon that the league this year has not experienced

It appeared a fairly defendable total when the holders put on 265-8 on a wicket where batting second was not an easy task. But it was fireworks all the way for Sonargaon after opener Al Shahriar started it all with a blazing 74. Mohammad Ashraful struck a captain's knock of 53 and Indian Sridharan Sriram hammered an unbeaten 93 as Sonargaon toppled the target with 7.4 overs to spare and six wickets in

The victory, their sixth in a row, brought the best of the starstudded Sonargaon since the club slapped financial punishment on its leading players for poor showing at the start of the league.

The win also took Sonargaon four points behind DOHS along with Mohammedan with 18 points each. But with three more matches in hand DOHS, on 22 points, needed one more win to close in on SONARGAON-DOHS their the second successive league

Mohammad Sporting Club also kept their title hopes alive after their five-wicket success against Victoria Sporting Club at the Dhanmondi Cricket Stadium.

Away at BKSP, Biman won the other Super-Six against Brothers Union by seven runs.

When Golam Rahman dropped Al Shahriar at extra cover he virtually threw the match away. Shahriar, then on 24, plundered 74 off 73 balls before being out in the 23rd but not before putting 138 runs on the board. With Al Shahriar in his aggressive best, Sonargaon saw 32 runs coming in first three overs.

tained nine savage hits across the rope. Ashraful carried on the thunder after Shahriar's departure, hitting a 39-ball 53. The champion right-hander struck five fours and a mid-wicket six against left-arm spinner Manjarul Islam before being bowled by experienced paceman Hasibul Hossain.

The 29-year-old left-hander only punished the bad deliveries to take Sonargaon to victory. He struck nine fours and one six in his chanceless 103-ball innings.

#### Federer survives a scare

World number one Roger Federer survived a major scare to beat unseeded German Tommy Haas in a gripping five-set fourth round match at the Australian Open Monday.

Federer looked headed for defeat when the 41st-ranked German came roaring back from two sets down to take the match into a fifth set, but the Swiss champion prevailed in the dramatic final

He finally came through 6-4, 6-0, 3-6, 4-6, 6-2 in 2hr 58min on Rod Laver Arena Federer remains on course to

land his second Australian Open crown and seventh Grand Slam title and will play Russian fifth seed Nikolay Davydenko in the quarterfinal on Wednesday.

The reigning Wimbledon and US Open champion was keen to address a painful loss to Haas at the same stage at the 2002 Australian Open when Haas won 10-8 in the fifth set after the Swiss held a match point at 5-6 in the final set.

Haas also posted a victory over Federer in the lead-up Kooyong Classic exhibition tournament here, but that loss doesn't count in

## Dhoni takes India to safety

Wicketkeeper Mahendra Dhoni and skipper Rahul Dravid hit contrasting centuries to pull India out of trouble in the second Test against Pakistan at the Iqbal Stadium here on Monday.

Dhoni smashed 116 not out off 123 balls for his maiden century and Dravid scored a patient 103 as India posted 441-5 in their first innings by stumps on the third day.

Dhoni batted with authority to spare India's blushes during a defiant 160-run stand for the unbroken sixth wicket with Pathan to consolidate the good work by Dravid and Venkatsai Laxman.

India were comfortably placed at lunch on 227-1 but lost Laxman (90), Dravid, Yuvraj Singh (four) and Sachin Tendulkar (14) in the space of 45 runs in a dramatic collapse.

### Cairns calls it a day been more impressive had his back into shape and regaining his

New Zealand's Chris Cairns announced his retirement from all international cricket Monday. putting an end to a stellar career spanning 15 years as one of his country's finest all-rounders.

Cairns, who notched a world record 87 Test-match sixes and is one of very few batsmen to average more than one six per Test, said his last match will be a Twenty20 encounter against the West Indies in Auckland next month.

"I feel that the time is right for me to retire from international cricket," said Cairns, the Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 2000.

"I still enjoy playing for the Black Caps and want to leave at a time when that enjoyment has not diminished, and when I feel that I am still performing at the top level and contributing to the success of The 35-year-old, who has lim-

ited himself to one-day internationals in recent seasons, is pulling up stumps just 50 runs short of the 5,000-run, 200-wicket double achieved by just two players in the limited-overs game -- Sri Lanka's Sanath Jayasuriya and South Africa's Jacques Kallis. Before retiring from Test cricket

in 2004, he became only the sixth player in world Test cricket to score 3,000 runs and take 200 wickets. Cairns was one of the game's great entertainers, mixing powerful

batting feats with some right-arm, fast-medium bowling spells. In 215 one-day internationals dating back to 1991, he scored

4,950 runs at an average of 29.46 and took 201 wickets at 32.80. As a Test cricketer, he scored

3,320 runs at 33.53 and took 218 wickets at 29.40. Those numbers could have career not been blighted by injury. The past couple of years proved


especially difficult as he nursed fragile knees as well as an ankle that has no ligament support.

He was axed from New Zealand's tour to South Africa late last year but responded to the setback by getting

# Hingis faces Clijsters next

Martina Hingis took another step on the comeback trail Monday, beating Samantha Stosur 6-1, 7-6 to reach the Australian Open quarterfinals.

Hingis, in her first tournament since coming back from a threeyear retirement, converted on her fourth match point, showing the same savvy she used to win five Grand Slam titles.

"I started off very well, I knew

that I had to be right there from the baseline shots, crisp volleys and start -- we both probably were very nervous," Hingis said. "I knew I couldn't give her any momentum."

The 25-year-old Swiss star next faces her biggest challenge so far against second-seeded Kim Clijsters, who has spent nearly all of her off-court time getting worked on by trainers.

Clijsters showed no signs of the back and hip pain that has bothered her for the last week as she beat 15th-seeded Francesca Schiavone of Italy for a 7-6, 6-4.

Hingis blunted Stosur's strong ground strokes with an oftenstunning blend of perfectly placed

soft drops that had the Australian dashing to the net for a pickup only to see the next shot lobbing over herhead.

Stosur, ranked 98th, seemed befuddled and almost on the verge of tears at times in the first set, giving the partisan crowd little to cheer about as she impatiently tried to hit winners. In a sign of things to come,

Hingis won the first point on a net court that dribbled over for a winner. She ran off the last five games of the first set, finishing it off in just 23 minutes. But the second set was tougher,

on a running forehand crosscourt pass that left Stosur virtually flatfooted. Both struggled with their serves, trading breaks four times in 12
