

BB for further fuel price hike to fight fiscal pressure

Bangladesh Bank (BB) has suggested further adjustment in fuel prices to contain fiscal pressure and establishment of a central bonded warehouse to keep the country's ready-made garment industry competitive in the present quota-free world market.

BB in its July-September, 2005 quarterly released yesterday pointed out that the country has met the challenges arisen out of the

oil and commodity price hike and phasing out of MFA (Multi-Fibers Agreement) quota through adjustment of exchange and interest rates and fuel prices.

"Further adjustment particularly in fuel prices will be necessary to contain the fiscal pressure. At the same time adjustment by the way of effective demand management will need to continue in near future to contain inflationary and BOP

revenue collection and expenditure pressure," the quarterly reads. According to it: "Easing of the

Iran trashes threats, calls for more talks

Mixing defiance with diplomacy, Iran said yesterday it did not fear Western threats over its nuclear programme and vowed to pursue uranium enrichment if taken to the UN Security Council for possible sanctions.

But it also called for more talks with the European Union to resolve a standoff that is helping drive up world oil prices.

"We have invited our European friends to return to talks," Foreign Minister Manouchehr Mottaki told

He said a "bridge of friendship' could be reached by respecting Iran's right to nuclear technology and by removing concerns it could divert this for an atomic arms

programme. Leading EU powers Germany, Britain and France have refused to hold more negotiations until Tehran reinstates a moratorium on uranium enrichment and other sensitive nuclear work.

The United States, keen for the UN nuclear watchdog to refer Iran to the council when it meets on February 2, called Tehran a potential threat to world security and energy supplies.

Rising tensions over Iran have combined with other global supply worries to push oil prices up more than \$10 since late December to within sight of a record \$70.85 a barrel on August 30.

The West suspects Iran is covertly seeking nuclear arms. Tehran says its programme aims only to generate electricity.

Iran's top nuclear negotiator Ali Larijani was quoted by London's Financial Times as saying Tehran would push ahead with uranium enrichment if referred to the Security Council

He also urged the EU to resume talks broken off this month after Tehran removed UN seals on enrichment equipment.

"If the negotiating route is open, we prefer to reach a conclusion through talks," Larijani told the newspaper. "But if this route is closed, we are obliged to follow up our other scenario. Everything depends on the way we are

Asked if there was a timeframe for uranium enrichment on an industrial scale, he said: "Yes. We have a plan for resumption."

Iran is not known to have any capacity for industrial-scale uranium enrichment. It declared this month that it was resuming a small-scale enrichment research project at its Natanz plant.

Biman resumes ticketing thru' Amadeus

Hundreds of travel agents across the country heaved a sigh of relief yesterday with Biman resuming air ticket bookings through Amadeus, one of the four global distribution systems (GDS) in operation in Bangladesh.

Amadeus, represented by Global Travel Distribution Bangla Limited (GTD) and owned by Amadeus India Pvt Ltd, counted a huge loss in revenues during the 45 days the national flag carrier Biman Bangladesh Airlines had refrained from getting its tickets booked by the company, official

After receiving a legal notice from the GTD on January 3, Biman finally withdrew the boycott it had slapped on Amadeus on December 8 in line with a High Court order following a writ petition filed by a group named Bangladesh Youth Economist Forum which had brought allegations of money laundering against the GTD.

As the majority of Bangladesh's over 500 recognised travel agents use the Amadeus system for air ticket bookings, 45 days of boycotting the system caused sufferings for many travel agents and resulted in financial losses to the GTD. Three other global distribution
