## Writable Cds

They usually are between 600 to 700 MB in capacity, and suitable for storing any forms of data- audio, video, images, documents, etc. As high-tech innovations wipe out the use of floppy disks and replace them with pen drives and CDs, they



become increasingly handy . The prices usually range from Tk.20 to Tk.30. Well-known brands include Sony, Maxwell and Melody.

# Re-writable Cds

They are different from the writable ones in the sense that they can be used over and over again. You can delete files that



you do not like, and write in new ones. Again, these are produced by the brands that also produce the writable ones. Prices: Tk. 100 to Tk.120.

# **CD** Writer

CDs, mind you, are not like floppy disksyou can not just copy and paste data into CDs from a PC. In order to transfer



data, what you would need is a CD writer. Prices start from around Tk. 3500, but you might consider going up to Tk. 6000, if you are not ready to compromise with quality. Most "big name" electronic companies produce writers. Worth mentioning are LG, Samsung and AVANTRIX.

# Mp3 Cds

Nowadays, you may consider buying mp3 CDs instead of sitting hours in front of the computer and downloading songs. You can play them over and over in your mp3 players or your computers. They are amazingly cheap at around Tk.50-60, and hold more songs than does a normal audio CD. Almost all types of songs are available in mp3s- Bangla, Hindi, English.

## **DVD Box Sets**

Missed out an episode of your favourite TV series? Want to watch a season that is not yet being aired in Bangladesh? Buying DVD box sets may just be your answer. Popular are the new seasons of Smallville, Desperate Housewives, Alias and Friends. I also found a South Park set that covers all

# CD carry-on cases

These are leather cases that can hold CDs, especially convenient for travel purposes. Prices vary widely, depending upon the quality, brand and storage space. Nevertheless, they are yours starting from around Tk. 200.

# Levi's in Bangladesh

Such is the impact of fashion on the world of today that even the most trying half-wit knows the effect of a brand name. Levi Strauss, it must be said, is a well known name in the fashion industry. Lets take a trip through memory lane if you please.

Levi Strauss came to San Francisco in 1853, at the age of twenty-four, to open a west coast branch of his brothers' New York dry goods business. He built his business into a very successful operation over the next twenty years. One of Levi's many customers was a tailor named Jacob Davis. Among Jacob's customers was a difficult man who kept ripping the pockets of the pants that Jacob made for him. Jacob tried to think of a way to strengthen the man's trousers, and one day hit upon the idea of putting metal rivets at the points of strain, such as on the pocket corners and at the base of the button fly. These riveted pants were an instant hit with Jacob's customers and he wanted to patent it. He needed a business partner and he immediately thought of Levi Strauss. On May 20, 1873, the two men received patent #139, 121 from the US Patent and Trademark office. That day is considered to be the official "birthday" of blue jeans. Around 1890, these pants were assigned the number 501, which they still bear today.

So before you start criticizing them understand that wearing a Levi is much

more than wearing just a pair of jeans. Excepting the cost factor however, the stores are excellent. There are a wide range of jeans to chose from and you also have T-shirts and tops available.

Giant Distribution Ltd (GDL), a sister concern Giant Group, got into an exclusive partnership with Levis Strauss and Co to open Levi's Exclusive stores in Bangladesh, to serve the youth segment to western wear for men and women by introducing the most original and classic denim brand Levi's. Through these stores GDL will bring to Dhaka the latest and the trendiest clothes in international fashion.

For the launching of Levi's in Bangladesh they organized a day-long event that is true to the statement "Quality never goes out of style". JPR Events organized the Official Levi's Launching at the Levi's Store located at 41 Kemal Ataturk Avenue, beside HSBC Banani counter. Artistes scheduled to perform later that evening- Shayne Hyrapiet and DJ Nihal were present at the launching even along with the Levi's models and DJ

Levi also has another store in Dhanmondi which is located on the Satmasjid Road.
