Launch dialogue on electoral reforms

EU troika asks country's 2 major political parties, stresses credible polls for sustaining democracy

The European Union yesterday urged the country's two major political parties to initiate an active dialogue on electoral reform issues to establish a cross-party confidence in the caretaker government and the Election Commission.

"It is essential to the stability and prospects of Bangladesh that the election takes place on schedule and with full participation, said a visiting EU troika in a press statement yesterday, the wrap-up day of its 3-day visit to Dhaka.

The troika led by Nikolaus

Scherk, Austrian foreign ministry director for Asia and the Pacific. came with a mandate to speak on behalf of all the 25 member states of the EU. The statement, which followed a wide range of dialogues

with important government and opposition leaders, high officials, civil society representatives and foreign diplomats in Dhaka, said a successful and credible election would need support from all politi-

"The EU therefore urges the government and the opposition to find a way to allow all-party participation," so that people can make their choice democratically, Scherk

According to the troika statement, the EU recognises the next general election as a milestone for Bangladesh's democracy, and peaceful, free and fair elections in 2007 would also send an important signal to the international community that a durable democracy is being cultivated here.

EU troika meets Hasina, stresses need for free EC

The visiting European Union (EU) troika yesterday met Leader of the Opposition Sheikh Hasina and once again stressed the need for an independent Election Commission (EC) to ensure free, fair and credible elections in Bangladesh.

"We are not here to advise, but we felt that the Election Commission needs to be independent, its funding be clear and it needs to be freed from the [authority of] Prime Minister's Office," delegation leader Nikolaus Scherk told newsmen after the meeting.

The EU troika, however, regretted not getting an opportunity to talk directly to the chief election commissioner (CEC) and the prime minister. Scherk said they wished to meet the PM but "apparently she seems to be very busy."

The central bank maintained that the tight monetary stance it is pursuing is not intended to slow down the output growth but to curb the excess demand arising from inflationary expectations.

"In view of the good post flood recovery of agricultural output and

Despite some weaknesses, the country's economy in the first half of the current fiscal year showed some positive features and achieving six per cent GDP growth would not be much difficult, observed Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI).

The leading business platform in its quarterly economic review (October-December 2005) attributed growth in manufacturing and other industrial sub sectors to the positive sign of economy.

Terming increasing inflationary pressure and the government's borrowing from the banks as the

the review suggested that the government takes effective measures for controlling inflation, solving problems of the infrastructure, particularly electricity and ports, and overcoming other weak points like tight monetary policy and increasing interestrate.
The MCCI review, referring to an

internal survey, said leading entrepreneurs expressed deep concern over political tensions in the country and criticised the government for its failure in taking necessary moves to defuse the tensions.

The entrepreneurs, however, appreciated the government for SEE PAGE 15 COL 3
