# Temporary staffs run NTRCA

## Second certification test uncertain

The Non-Government Teachers' Registration and Certification Authority (NTRCA) is yet to be fully operational due to lack of adequate manpower and infrastructural

The authority was formed more than 10 months back to issue certificates to candidates willing to get teaching jobs in private schools

No one has so far been appointed permanently in any of

Four top posts including chairman of the NTRCA were temporarily filled up by senior government officials to arrange the firstever certification test on November 25 and 26 last year.

Presently, the posts of chairman and two members are lying vacant.

certification test was held with the assistance of the officials and staffs of Dhaka Board.

But the next test has become uncertain as the board personnel will remain busy till July for SSC and HSC examinations.

"We shall have to wait for them to hold another teachers' certification test as the NTRCA still lacks necessary facilities," said Gazi Md Ahsanul Kabir, one senior member of the authority.

He, however, hoped that the NTRCA would not be dependent on other bodies for long citing that the work on filling up of its different posts has progressed significantly.

"It is totally unfair as I am interested in getting both the certifi-cates," said Ashraf Uddin, a candi-

date of the first test. He also alleged that the first certification test was held only on 45 elective subjects while there are more than 150 subjects in the syllabus of schools, colleges, madrasas and vocational institu-

Prof Shaheda Obaed, NTRCA former member (Evaluation and Examination) also acknowledged the limitations of the first certifica-

"We had to arrange the first test within a very short time depending on the voluntary service of the officials and staffs of Dhaka Board," she added.

Prof Shaheda also stressed the need for arranging the second certification test as early as possible as the candidates appeared in the first examination amid various

Kabir, also the chairman of the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB), hoped that the NTRCA would be able to arrange the next certification test comprising more than 100 elective subjects.

Thousands of posts in nongovernment educational institutions have been lying vacant for about a year because of delay in arranging the certification test.

According to Non-Government Teachers' Registration and Certification Authority Act 2005 which came into effect on March 20, a candidate\_must have the NTRCA certificate to be recruited in non- government junior and high schools, colleges, madrasas, technical and business manage ment institutions.

The third convocation of Jahangirnagar University (JU) is going to be held on the campus on February 2 amid much enthusiasm and festivity.

The programme will begin with a colourful procession of the graduates led by President and Chancellor Prof Dr Iajuddin Ahmad at 11:00am on the day. The Chancellor will preside over the ceremony while former Chief Justice Mustafa Kamal will deliver a speech as convocation speaker. Dr M Osman Farruk, minister for education, and ANM Ehsanul Hoque, state minister for education, will be present in the ceremony.

The university authorities confirmed that all preparations have been completed to make the event a success. A total of 2,729 students who have completed their bachelor (honours) and master degrees from 1998 to 2003 will receive their academic certificates on the convocation day. Though about 4,500 students completed the degrees in the mentioned period, the rest did not get registered to attend the function. Certificates will also be given to 20 M Phil and 48 Ph D degree holders from the university while 13 students will receive gold medals for their outstandingacademic achievement.

The distribution of convocation gowns will continue till January 31 and all students have been requested

to collect gowns in time. 13 buses will ply from different points of the capital to the university on the scheduled routes from 8:30am on the convocation day for the convenience of the participants. The bus schedules were published in national dailies.

An estimated Tk 54 lakhs will be spent for the ceremony. Of which the university authorities will seek an assistance of Tk 22 lakhs from the University Grants Commission while the rest will come from students' registration fees and donations.


#### BPRA election on Feb 28
