Time for preparing voter roll ends today

EC undecided whether to continue unfinished task

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The time limit for the field level work of the controversial fresh voter list expires today while the Election Commission (EC) remains undecided whether to continue the unfinished task

Instead of deciding on the next course of action in this regard, the EC prefers waiting for the outcome of the appeal it plans to file Wednesday against the January 4 High Court (HC) directives for revising the existing electoral roll.

Election Commissioner SM Zakaria last week told reporters that the commission would take a decision after it has the court's ruling on the appeal.

"Preparation for filing the appeal is going on. I hope it will be filed on the day after tomorrow [Wednesday]," counsel for the EC Khondakar Mahbubuddin Ahmed told The Daily Star yesterday.

About the commission's opting to wait till the appeal is disposed of, he said there is no relation between the ongoing voter-listing job and

"The Election Commission can extend the time limit if the task is not completed on schedule," he

Zakaria and secretary in charge of the EC Secretariat Mohammad Zakoria declined to talk to the press on the issue

Meanwhile, Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) MA Aziz who left hospital yesterday has not joined the office or convened any

A source in the EC Secretariat yesterday said the secretariat might issue some directives for the field level staff today.

The field level work, which includes information collection on the prospective voters and scrutiny of those, has been scheduled for

completion by January 31.

A number of district election officers, who have already informed the EC that it will not be completed by that time, said they did not receive any directives from the EC Secretariat as of yesterday.

"I tried no less than 50 times to contact the Secretariat, but nobody picks up the phone," a district election officer told The Daily Star yesterday, wishing anonymity.

"We will start compiling the information gathered about the eligible voters on February 1 as timetabled earlier," said the election officer adding that according to the schedule the draft voter list should be published on February

"We won't enrol anyone new in the list after January 31 unless we receive a directive extending the

The responsibility for the fuel crisis in North Bengal districts goes to the BPC, as it didn't take any measures, before the decline of navigability of the rivers, to ensure adequate fuel supply to meet the increasing demand during the dry season, they said at a press conference in the capital yesterday.

At the press conference, the pump owners under the banner of Bangladesh Petroleum Dealers, Distributors, Agents and Petrol Pump Owners Association claimed that none of them have stocked up

fuelin petrol pumps.
"If the government investiga-tion finds stocking up of fuel in underground reservoir that exceeds the approved quantity, the pump owner concerned should be punished," said Mohammad Nazmul Haq, president of the association of 7400 members SEE PAGE 15 COL 4

US wants all to stop aid to Hamas govt

Israel freezes funding to Palestinian Authority

AGENCIES, London/ Jerusalem

The United States wants other nations to cut off aid to a Hamasled Palestinian government, Rice said ahead of an international strategy session on Middle East Rice ruled out any US financial

assistance to a Hamas government. Humanitarian help to the Palestinians, many of whom are poor and unemployed, is likely on a "case-by-case basis," Rice said Sunday. She indicated that the administration would follow through on aid promised to the current, US-backed Palestinian

government led by President Mahmoud Abbas. "The United States is not prepared to fund an organisation that advocates the destruction of Israel, that advocates violence and that refuses its obligations," under an international framework for eventual Middle East peace. Rice said.

Rice was meeting other members of the so-called Quartet of would-be Middle East peacemakers yesterday. The group, which includes the United States, Russia, the European Union and the

United Nations, is already or record as saying "there is a funda mental contradiction between armed group and militia activities and the building of a democratic

Hamas urged the international community Monday not to stop its funding to the Palestinian Authority as key players in the stalled peace process debated the implications of the Islamist movement's election win.

Ismail Haniya's comments came as EU foreign ministers and representatives of the quartet were thrashing out a common response to the election victory for a group, which is committed to Israel's destruction and has carried out dozens of suicide attacks during a five-year uprising

"We call for dialogue without preliminary conditions and in a spirit of neutrality," Haniya told a news conference in Gaza City, reading out a message addressed to the quartet made up of the EU. United States, Russia and the United Nations. Earlier Israel has decided to
