Alluring show-tunes of by-gone days

Twas an early October day and I was passing by a busy London supermarket area, when the mellow tune of a flute tantalised my ears. I could not but stand mesmerised, till the hypnotic melody came to an end. I can't express the feeling in words. A feeling of nostalgia overwhelmed me. I looked around and found two young South American musicians playing on their indigenous flutes

I approached them and asked if I could get a recording of the tune they had just played. They handed me a CD and told me the composition is called By-gone Days. I gave them ten pounds in return and was in a bliss that could only be expressed in the universal language of music. This is the power of music! Music triumphs where language fails, and this, in particular, is the role of music in films. It has to express the particular mood of a sequence where the dialogues

Unfortunately, our filmmakers had never properly appreciated the basic role of music. They have always indulged in exploiting music to "fill up the void"; ignoring the fact that silence sometimes is the best music. Of course, there are exceptions, depending on the

We all know that songs play a vital part in our films and seem to

which are a few examples of what emotional and aesthetic effect can be achieved by proper use of songs Some of the best examples of

situational songs in films are per-haps Satyatjit Ray's Pather Panchali where he aptly used a traditional song Haire din to gelo shondya holo, paar koro amarey to create an atmosphere of the ulti-mate tragedy of human life. Simi-larly, we may remember *The last* post played on trumpet by a fellow soldier at the tragic death of his friend in a combat in the famous film From Here to Eternity. Many such examples can be cited from memorable international films. Apart from our heritage of folk

songs we also have a rich tradition of lyrical or poetic music (kabbya sangeet). Our composers, lyricists and singers, all have put their best to add to this genre. Lyricists who have made a mark during the 50s to 70s were Professor Abu Hena Mustafa Kamal, Professor Md Muniruzzaman and poet Shamsur Rahman. Songs such as Amar prothom dekha shey khon tirey written by Abu Hena Mustafa Kamal and sung by this author, gained popularity; Mir Kasem Khan composed the song. Ami shagorer o neel penned by Abu Hena Mustafa Kamal composed by Hena Mustafa Kamal, composed by

Abdul Ahad and sung by Ferdousi Rahman is a classic

During the late 60s Md Rafiquzzaman, Gazi Mazharul Anwar and Nazrul Islam Babu attained popularity as lyricists; they continue to enthrall the music aficionados to this date with their creations. Composers like Abdul Ahad, Samar Das, Dheer Ali Monsur, Abdul Latif, Khandakar Nurul Alam, Subal Das, Sattya Shaha, Altaf Mahmood, Ali Hossain are the pioneers in creating an original style of lyrical music in Bangladesh. After the Liberation War, Alauddin Ali, Alam Khan, Sheikh Sadi Khan, Ahmed Imtiaz Bulbul and others introduced a new trend in music composition.

Songs or lyrical music have always been more popular than classical or absolute music in this part of the subcontinent, which Tagore had also observed in his writings on the mass taste in music in Bengal or Bangla speaking peo ple. In fact, Bangladesh could be proud of reigning over the musical arena of both Bangladesh and West Bengal as a whole during late 60s and 70s in respect of quality, quan tity and creativity.


Chandra Shekhar: self-effacing but self-assured

Self-effacing but determined, Chandra Shekhar, who has amazed gallery viewers and connoisseurs over the decades, revels in making excellent pen-sketches and oils. He has not known easy accolades like some of his Bangladeshi contemporaries, who prefer to paint overseas. He continues to toil and struggle in his own country and goes in to do a stint of commercial work every now and then, to bring home the bread

He has been a "friend, guide and philosopher" to many successful artists at the Institute of Fine Arts (IFA), Dhaka University, and yet gives credit to his mastery in paintings and sketches to his teachers at IFA. He has gone on to do bold experimentation, believing that art must progress, and meet the demands of the time. He has been in quest of a soul pitch in his creative art for ages now.

Before entering the Department of Fine Arts in 1976, he used to copy images from calendars and billboards as a child. He was also motivated by the fascinating rickshaw art, which he viewed around his house in a nearby garage for vehicles. Again, when he found reproductions of artists like Pablo Picasso and other world-renowned masters, he reproduced them ad lib. However, Chandra Shekhar says he has

no particular favourites in masters either in the west or east. He says that he is motivated by any good artwork that stirs him, irrespective of its acknowledgement by critiques

Today, when he has seen the Louvers, Tate, Pompadour and other European and Asian galleries, he still feels that when he mused over the reproductions as a child, the impact was more breathtaking and bewildering. "My reaction was that artists in our country, were and still are equally powerful," he says, "For good art a necessary environment is requisite. This can exist anywhere in the world. The factor that shapes art is the socio-political situation, I believe. The Liberation War, e.g., ushered in some of the finest work, such as that of Shahabuddin. Religion too guides art, as we know that non-figurative art tends to prevail in the Muslim world. Zainul Abedin, for instance, went into abstract art, as he dwelt during the Pakistan days. Murtaja Baseer received rave reviews for his figurative art." Meanwhile, the rickshaw painting of his time (when only brush and oils are used) also aroused his penchant for daring choice of colours and lines.

Chandra Shekhar says that he was not into sophisticated art orientation "as are some of the artists who have their origins in the bourgeois or upper echelons of society," as he puts it. He was, however encouraged and egged on by his elder sister, Maya Dey, who had creative and intellectual contacts in the capital city, when he was a child in

As for his assessment of the state of art, today, in the 21st century, he believes that there is not much individual beauty in it. He says that one artist tends to copy another. "We do not necessarily have much genuine feelings, philosophy or drive," he comments.
