The JMB kingpin gave the statement to Metropolitan Magistrate's Court under section 164.

Magistrate Moksedur Rahman recorded a five-page statement of Mohammad.

Mohammad said he had conducted the serial bombings in Chittagong as per directives from JMB chief Shaikh Abdur Rahman to establish Islamic rule in the country.

Mystery shrouds death of ansar at Adamjee EPZ

An ansar member died under mysterious circumstances at Adamjee Export Processing Zone (EPZ) in Narayanganj yesterday

Police recovered the body of Montu Mia, 33, at about 7:00am from near the No 3 jetty inside Adamjee EPZ. The body had an iron rod pierced through its throat.

According to a source, Montu incidentally saw a gang stealing valuable machinery from the closed down Adamjee Jute Mill while on his guard duty on Saturday night. The gang killed him apparently to hide the misdeed.

An influential group has been engaged in looting the machinery of the mill worth crores of taka since the process of turning the mill into Adamjee EPZ started, the source

Govt acts as a switch operator of militants

B Chy tells party meet

Bikalpa Dhara Bangladesh (BDB) President AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury yesterday said the four-party alliance government is playing the role of a switch operator of the militants.

"The militant attack starts when the government switches on and stops when it switches off," he said while speaking at a meeting at the National Press Club in the city.

The meeting was organised by the city unit of BDB on the occasion of introducing its thana committee members

B Chowdhury said the government will have to give accounts of its every failure to people in running the country.

"This government has no moral rights to remain in power for its failure to provide the farmers with sufficient electricity and diesel in time," he said.

The BDB chief said the alliance government could generate only 100 MW electricity in its four and a half years rule while it promised in

its election manifesto to ensure

sufficient electricity for all. He demanded of the government to allow BDB's parliament member to table its reform proposals on caretaker government and electoral system in parliament for

detailed discussion. "People will never bring back this government to power as it failed miserably in running the state affairs," said BDB Secretary General Major (Retd) Abdul

He claimed the BDB would soon emerge as the number one political party in the country.

BDB leader Mahi B Chowdhury MP and Major (Retd) MA Halim also spoke on the occasion.

Earlier, BDB senior leaders introduced the party's newly selected 16 thana committee members at the meeting.
