Parties urged not to nominate 'black money' holders

Speakers at a workshop yesterday urged the political parties not to nominate 'black money' holders and musclemen for the upcoming parliamentary election.

They also called on the people to be more careful about the potential candidates in their respective constituencies

Sujan, a civil society initiative to promote good governance, organ-ised the workshop on 'Political reforms in Bangladesh and determining responsibilities with regard to the ninth parliamentary election' in the city.

The political parties should decide right now that they would refrain from nominating any 'black money' holder, loan defaulter and person with criminal records for the upcoming election, said Prof Muzaffer Ahmad, president of

He also stressed the need for ensuring full transparency in the election-related expenditure of the

"Voters should also be given enough opportunities to know details about the candidates so that they do not cast their votes in favour of a wrong person," he
