### Banglabazar bookshops' strike Mar 7 Withdrawal of VAT demanded

Bangladesh Book Publishers and Sellers' Association yesterday demanded of the government to withdraw value added tax (VAT) from imported papers and reduce price of locally produced papers to ensure supply of books to readers at reasonable prices.

"Price of local newsprint now stands at Tk 62,000 per ton while just six months ago it was Tk 42,000," said association President Abu Taher while addressing a press conference at its office in the city.

He said book publishers are also buying imported newsprint at a higher price due to imposition of VAT at the rate of Tk 20,000 to 22,000 perton. Similarly, price of one ream of

local white print paper has now increased to Tk 850 to 950 form Tk 500 to 600, while an extra Tk 22,000 to 24,000 has to be paid for purchasing one ton of imported white print paper. Abu Taher added.

He alleged that owners of local paper industries are increasing the price of their products at will because of government's imposition of high VAT on imported papers. Abu Taher announced that all the bookshops at Banglabazar in the

city will remain closed on March 7 to press home their demands. He also threatened to launch

further agitation if their demands are not met by the government. Replying to a question, Abu Taher said the association will soon move for legal action if the govern-

ment dose not pay compensation for the loss of about Tk 1,000 crore that the publishers invested for publishing the new textbooks under the uni-track education system which was later postponed.

Titled the Building Construction (Amendment) Act, 2006, it proposed a number of amendments to the 54-years-old Building Construction Act, 1952

According to the bill, designing or approving or implementing a building construction plan in contravention to any provision shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term that may extend to seven years, or with fine not less that Tk 50,000, or with both.



of British mining company Asia Energy in its report styled 'The Impact of Mining Activities on Agriculture'. It says there would be a net gain of at least Tk 154 crore over agricultural output in the area during the mine's lifetime.

The maximum deficit in value of agricultural production occurs in about 10 years and the break even point, when gains equal losses, occurs within 15 years," the report

"Thereafter there would be more agricultural production than if the land is left in its present condition and is undisturbed by mining."

Asia Energy Corporation (Bangladesh) as part of its extensive social and environmental preparations for the mine assigned Dr Chris Johansen, a globally renowned agricultural research and development consultant, together with Md Abdullah Sani, an irrigation engineer, to conduct the study.

The two experts studied 5,192 hectares of mine footprint area of mostly cultivated land and water that will be progressively taken out of and put back into productive use as the mine advances. The remainder of the mine's total land requirement of 5,933 hectares is

Taking into account that the land acquired for the mine will be phased out gradually, the cumulative loss of agricultural production in the area over the full 38-year ifetime of the mine was estimated at Tk 702 crore.

Increased productivity of farmers in the vicinity of the mine who will be assisted in adopting improved agricultural methods, and cultivation of fast growing tropical fodder grasses, legumes and trees on the overburden and the mined areas that are backfilled will compensate for that lost production within 15 years, the report

Over the 38-year duration of the mine, the value of agricultural products resulting from adoption of improved technology in areas adjacent to the mine footprint would be an estimated Tk 153 crore.
