# Signs of panic as bird flu | Poor planning takes wing in Europe

#### AFP. Paris

A French mayor banning chicken from school canteens. Germans abandoning cats by the hundreds, Greeks and Italians virtually axing poultry from their diets are all signs that a worried Europe is inching toward what some have called a bird flu psychosis.

In Austria, a provincial hospital in Burgenland has even reserved 20 percent of its beds for possible bird flu patients, even though no human nfections have been reported anywhere in Europe.

Indeed, despite assurances from officials that health risks are negligible, an edgy public is taking its own, not always rational, precautions against the deadly virus.

Their first line of defence has been to stop eating poultry, even if experts have said that cooked fowl poses no threat.

In countries where there have been avian outbreaks of the deadly H5N1 strain, poultry sales have been hit especially hard.

In Greece, consumption has plummeted by 75 percent in three weeks, according to the country's largest poultry farmers' association. "If sales continue falling at this rate, poultry farms may have to close association head Spyros Nonikas told AFP on Friday.

Fearing a public panic, Nonikas has urged the Greek broadcasting regulator to ensure that TV channels are "more moderate about what they say on this issue."

In Italy, where poultry meat sales have dropped off by 70 percent since an H5N1 outbreak among wild, migra-tory birds, many butchers have simply

The gathering panic across Europe reatens to have a ruinous impact on the continent's multi-billion dollar poultry industry, as well as ancillary sectors such as feed suppliers.

Europe's largest poultry producer, the Brittany-based Doux group, announced Thursday that it would temporarily cut 500 to 600 jobs -- 10 to 15 percent of the company's workforce in France -- until at least June 30. A drop in sales of 25 to 30 percent just in the last week has come on top of

an earlier fall of 15 to 20 percent since October 2005, a company spokesman said.

In Bosnia, sales have dropped off 90 percent, a spokesman for an association grouping 300 poultry farmers said Friday.

The German federation of poultry farmers estimated Friday that bird flu had already cost its members 134 million euros (160 million dollars) since last fall.

Politicians, health officials and even a Catholic bishop have all tried to calm public fears.

In Greece's northern region of Thessaloniki, where a bird flu outbreak has axed poultry consumption by 80 percent, local authorities and schools have launched information campaigns, and poultry producers offered 1,500 grilled chickens on Wednesday to passers-by in the port city of Salonika.

In France, the bishop of Aire et Dax in the southwest -- the country's largest poultry and foie grasproducing region -- appealed to his lock to keep eating chicken.

"I ask Catholics in the Landes department to keep their heads, to maintain their traditional habits and to eat poultry as usual, notably during the season of Lent which has just begun," Philippe Breton said in message to be read out in churches over the weekend

"Policymakers talk a lot about smuggling of petroleum products. But where do the smugglers get them? They get it from the coastal tankers. If the policymakers really mean business, they must stop such pilferage," a top official noted

Furthermore, the country's petroleum storage facilities built in the early seventies can only maintain fuel inventory for 30 days. This threatens petroleum security and also puts the nation at a disadvantage in purchasing larger quantum of oil when the price is comparatively low.

According to oil industry sources, to meet the domestic oil demand growth of 10 percent a vear, the government must follow a policy of upgrading discharging facilities, storage capacity and crude oil refining capacity.

Back in 1971 the country consumed only 150,000-200,000 tonnes of petroleum. The demand shot up to 3.5 million tonnes in 2005-06. Yet, the country's petroleum import, storage and processing infrastructures, which were set up in the early seventies, hardly expanded to meet the growing demand.

Roughly, petroleum related infrastructure grew on make-shift basis, like expanding storage facilities only by 30 percent over the years, which is too inadequate, noted an official

Prime Minister Ibrahim al-Jaafari warned preachers not to incite hatred or violence in their sermons, threatening them with "severe measures."

"Our hope is that Friday sermons be sermons of unity," al-Jaafari said in a statement late Thursday. "The street is angry and they should know how to calm the people and reassure them that the government will do all it can to pass through this period."

Security forces sealed off Bachdad. preventing most vehicles from entering or eaving the city of 7 million, said Capt. Adil Mohan of the traffic police.

Armed police and soldiers in bulletproof vests manned checkpoints across the capital, preventing most cars and motorcycles from leaving their neighbourhoods.

The recent surge of violence has complicated negotiations for a new, broad-based government after December parliamentary elections. US officials consider an inclusive government essential if they are to start withdrawing troops before the end of the year.

Sunni Arabs walked out of the talks last week. accusing the Shia-led government and security forces of standing by as Sunni mosques were attacked. On Thursday, the main Sunni bloc joined Kurdish and secular parties in demanding that the dominant Shia alliance withdraw its nomination of al-Jaafari for another term as prime minister, threatening the country with new political turmoil.

BCIC for the loss it incurs in selling urea at Tk 4.800 a tonne, which is Tk 1,200 less than production cost.

"The government pays fat bills to meet the price gap but it does not provide the subsidy money to BCIC With its ageing urea factories, BCIC is facing fund crisis for their maintenance," said Imaam-Uz Zaman. The factories are losing productivity operating year after year without oper maintenance, he added.

"No urea factory has been set up since 1990, when the biggest one in the country -- Jamuna Fertiliser Factory -- was built in Jamalpur. The first one -- Fenchuganj Fertiliser Factory --was set up 42 years ago."

The six urea factories produced 20 lakh tonnes last fiscal year, he said. "I doubt whether we'll be able to produce 18 lakh tonnes this year.' Jamuna factory has gone out of production for the third time in the st six months.

"We don't get money in time for overhauling the factories. All the factories are making losses. We're deprived of our subsidy bills. Government's subsidy allocation is entirely eaten up by imported urea, said the BCCI chairman. If things go on like this, local urea production

would dwindle further, he feared. When contacted, industries ministry sources said the proposed move for expansion of the joint venture Karnaphuli Fertiliser Company (Kafco) would result in an

increase in urea production but that would be of no significance for the country since it has to buy Kafco fertiliser at international market price.

Sources in the ministry and BCIC said the government has bought three lakh tonnes of urea from Kafco this fiscal year at a rate of Tk 18,000
