Domar upazila town in Nilphamari wore a festive look with colourful posters all around, processions and miking for the chairman candidatesAwami League-backed Al Azhar Hossain and local BNP leader Mosabber Hossain Manu.

But their main campaigners are AL Central Publicity Secretary and cultural personality Asaduzzaman Noor MP and the prime minister's nephew and former BNP lawmaker Shahrin Islam Tuhin as their fate in Domar in the next parliamentary election depends on outcome of the municipal polls to be held tomorrow.

Noor and Tuhin are moving door to door, leading processions and addressing small rallies, appealing

The participants included teachers, journalists, government officials, lawyers and the elite of the town.

The programme was organised by Satkhira Unnayan Network, a combine of ten NGOs, in observance of the

International Women's Day.
Chaired by Principal Asit Kumar

Majumdar, the rally was addressed by, among others, journalist Prof. Abu Ahmed, Nurul Huda, Tazibur Rahman, Farida Akhtar Banu, Dilip Kumar Dev and Prof. Pabitra Mohon

They called for launching social movement to eliminate violence against women and ensure equal rights in different professions.

As repression on women and violation of their rights start from family, these should be stopped there first, they said and urged male counterarts

to change their attitude.

Women never enjoy equal rights in marriage, jobs and owning family

property under the Muslim Family Code. This should be changed, they

Domestic violence should not be

considered a personal or a family matter. Women should be considered as equal partners in decisionmaking at family level, they said. Women's empowerment is a pre-

requisite to protect their rights they said and urged NGOs and government agencies to take steps for their education and employment.

#### MURDER OF 2 RU TEACHERS

### Arrest of Shibir leader Salehi demanded

Rajshahi University Teachers' Association (Ruta) yesterday formed a human chain in front of the university main gate demanding arrest and punishment to killers of Prof S Taher Ahmed and Prof Muhammad Yunus.

Several hundred teachers, students and officials joined the human chain, carrying placards and ban-

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), students wing of opposition Awami League, also took out a procession and held a rally in front of

Speakers at the rally alleged that Jamaat-Shibir leaders are trying to protect Prof Taher's alleged killer Salehi.

They threatened tougher agitation if Salehi is not arrested and punished.

Earlier, on Friday evening, Rajshahi Professionals' Coordinating Council also brought out a procession in the city and held a rally at Shaheb Bazar zero point demanding arrest and trial of Shibir leader Salehi for his alleged involvement in the murder of Prof Taher.

At least 82 women committed suicide last year, up from 20 in the previous year and 14 in 2003. Most of the suicide victims were housewife and the main reason behind the incidents was torture by husbands and their families for dowry, according to studies by some NGOs.

"Most of the suicide incidents are due to violence," said the executive director of Mukti Nari-O-Shishu Unnayan Sangstha.

Husbands were responsible for violence in most of the cases. Other

family members were also found involved in torture for dowry. In a few cases, poverty was behind torture by husbands, NGO sources said.

According to sources at Kushtia General Hospital, at least 45 women were treated after they took poison to commit suicide last year and 22 died in the hospital.

In most of the incidents, no case was filed by victims' relatives. Police recorded those as 'unnatural deaths' the sources and

deaths', the sources said.

Police said murder cases were filed with the six police stations in only 35 of the 82 incidents of suicide last year. Eighteen murder cases were

filed in 2004 and 19 in 2003. Charge sheet is yet to be submitted in any of the 35 murder cases filed last year, they said.

Only two cases were investigated and charge sheet submitted in 18 cases in 2004, police said.
