7 JMB Shura men sued for sedition

Govt files case in Mymensingh as decision of Aug 17 serial blasts taken there

The government yesterday filed a sedition case for the first time against all seven members of Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB)'s Majlish-e-Shura, the highest decision-making body.

Officer-in-Charge of Muktagachha Police Station in Mymensingh Police Inspector Sheikh Mahbubur Rahman filed the case with Mymensingh Cognisance Court yesterday afternoon on orders of the home ministryWednesday.

The court ordered Muktagachha police to investigate

The much-anticipated case was filed in Mymensingh as the law enforcers learnt that the decision to carry out blasts across the country on August 17 last year was taken

at a meeting there between June and August. The militants decided to go for such a huge scale terrorist act mainly 'to get the message about their strength over to the government'

Lawmakers' good bills get ignored in JS

Instructions of the law ministry stand in the way to the lawmakers expressing views in the form of a private member's bill, a parliamentary procedure that seeks to strengthen democracy and promote good governance.

The ruling and opposition lawmakers proposed some 14 bills for amendments to the constitution to check frequent House boycotts and the Supreme Court judges' feeling 'embarrassed'. They aim also to ensure individual freedom of the party lawmakers and consolidating the positions of the speaker and the deputy speaker. About two years ago, the parlia-

mentary standing committee on private members' bills and resolutions recommended that the House allow 11 constitution amendment bills to be placed in parliament.

But ignoring the rules of procedure of the Jatiya Sangsad, the law

minister in a letter to the speaker on February 3, 2005 suggested taking permission from the leader of the House before placing any private member's bill in parlia-

The rules of procedure allow a lawmaker to introduce a private member's bill and it does not require a go-ahead from the leader

KHALEDA'S VISIT TO INDIA

Security to dominate talks with Manmohan

The issue of security is likely to dominate the discussions between Dhaka and New Delhi during Prime Minister Khaleda Zia's upcoming state visit to India since both the countries are concerned about it, Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan said yesterday.

"We must discuss the issue of security with India with open mind to have solutions. This is not only an issue of Bangladesh or India alone...it's a global concern," he said while talking to a group of diplomatic correspondents at his Prime Minister Khaleda Zia is

due to pay her three-day visit to India beginning on March 20. About India's security concern,

Morshed Khan said it is obvious that being a big country India might have its security concerns, but at the same time, Bangladesh, though a small neighbour, is also concerned about the question of "Bangladesh and India have a

long porous border of over some 4,000 kilometres. As a result criminals often tend to cross the border for shelter after committing crimes," the foreign minister said adding that a list of Bangladeshi fugitive criminals has been handed over to the Indian authorities.

Reiterating Bangladesh's policy, he said, "We'll not allow anyone to use the territory of Bangladesh to be used against any neighbour or any foreign country.
