

Tigers guard against complacency

volte-face Bangladesh have been warned against complacency when they go into the second one-day interna-

tional against Kenya in Khulna The Tigers are flying high after

winning the first game at Bogra by a record 131 runs in a match where they had posted 300 runs for the first

"We are confident but not complacent. We made a very decent start in the series and now our main target is to carry on the momentum. There is no scope to take Kenya lightly after a convincing victory," said Bangladesh captain Habibul Bashar ahead of his first game at his hometown.

The match starts at 9:30am with Bangladesh Television (BTV) and Channel i beaming live coverage from the Khulna Divisional Stadium. which will make its debut as the fifth purpose-built international cricket enue of the country

The south-west port city has already been gripped by cricket fever with tickets for the 15,000 capacity stadium sold out.

Bangladesh have announced an unchanged team that set records on a roll in Bogra.

The wounded Kenyans, who came here with an impressive headto-head record of 6-1, on the other hand, warned that they would bite

Bashar however was upbeat to repeat their first match performance in his home ground and take his team to safety by winning the sec-

'We are not thinking about series whitewash or something like that rather our main focus is to improve match by match. It would be really fantastic for us if we could continue our batting flow in the series. We want to improve in every department but you know batting is our

main concern," he added.

"It was refreshing that our toporder got runs in the first match. And they should carry it in the second match just to prove that it was not a fluke. I have confidence in my batsmen because they have the ability to deliver," said Bashar.

The 33-year-old also expressed his satisfaction over the pitch and

"It is a very good batting wicket and the outfield is fantastic. I definitely want to win the toss here," said Bashar, who is yet to call the coin incorrectly since the home series against Sri Lanka last month.

"We are frustrated by the first match performance but it was not our real strength. We have the ability to play much better cricket. We are determined to bounce back in the series tomorrow," said Kenyan vice-captain Thomas Odoyo while talking to the reporters in the absence of skipper Steve Tikolo.

Kenya, who stunned the world by making it to the semifinals in the

2003 World Cup in South Africa, however have been starving for international exposure since then. It was only last month when they toured Zimbabwe for a five-match one-day series and they did well to draw it 2-2 after losing the first

"Bangladesh have improved a lot

as they got opportunities to play enough international cricket as a Test playing nation which was not the case for us," lamented Odoyo.

Meanwhile, it will be the last match where the 'super-sub' rule will be applicable. The ICC has decided to abandon the innovative idea following criticism of cricketers and

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president Ali Asghar on Sunday denied allegations of any irregularities in ticket selling for the second one-day match between Bangladesh and Kenya to be held at the Khulna Divisional Stadium today.

"A total of 15,950 tickets have been sold and there were no irregularities in ticket selling," said Asghar at a press conference on Sunday.

Asghar, who is also the lawmaker of Khulna, however was more excited to bring the international cricket caravan to the southeast port city.

Sri Lanka Cricket has named lefthanded batsman Jehan Mubarak, a veteran of seven Tests and 20 ODIs, as captain to lead two separate teams during their 20-day trip. Mubarak also visited with the Lankan senior team for the ODI series against Bangladesh in February.

The first four-day Test will start on March 23 in Dhaka and the second and the final match will take place at Bogra from March 30.

The three one-day matches are scheduled for Bogra (April 4) and Khulna (April 6 and 8).

Razzaq shines in low-scoring drama

Abdul Razzaq anchored Pakistan during a hard-fought four-wicket victory over Sri Lanka in the second one-day international here on Sunday.

The all-rounder struck a defiant 41 not out as Pakistan overcame a top-order collapse to pass the home side's meagre 130 and take an unbeatable 1-0 lead in the threematch series.

The first match was abandoned due to rain on Friday.

Razzaq played an uncharacteristically subdued 101-ball knock. He did not hit a boundary off the first 98 deliveries before unleashing some big shots to seal a memorable win with over five overs to spare.

Razzag, who had earlier in the day bagged two wickets, hit seamer Nuwan Kulasekara for a four, a six and then a winning four through mid-wicket off consecutive balls.

He added 35 for the sixth wicket with Mohammad Yousuf (26) and an unfinished 52 for the next with Kamran Akmal (20) after the other batsmen failed to apply themselves on a pitch not conducive to strokeplay.

Pakistan came under pressure after throwing away their first few Hard-hitting opener Shahid Afridi
