In her deposition yesterday three months pregnant Shanta, also a mother of a ten-year old boy, said on the day of the incident, she arrived at the scene to drop her son at school. When clashes between the police and pickets erupted, she took shelter at a nearby clinic. A group of policemen and policewomen dragged her out of the clinic and beat her mercilessly. The group of policemen and policewomen were also verbally abusive during the beating. She said for ten minutes the policemen and policewomen encircled her and beat her brutally. As she pleaded with the deputy commissioners of police Mazharul Haque and Kohinoor Mia for mercy, they asked their men and women to drag her into a prison van and break her hands and legs so that

she may never join a picket.

Just after the deposition, Public Prosecutor Mohammad Akhtaruzzaman, who is automatically appointed by the government to represent the complainant, surprisingly requested the court to take into account whether or not the case could be accepted. He said a case has already been filed with the CMM court, which is being investigated by the Inspector General of Police. "She was wearing a pair of trainers during the alleged torture," Akhtaruzzaman told the court.

"The benefit from the direct investment impact will be highly sensitive to the pricing of gas," Prof Mahmud wrote in the report.

"Asubsidy of US\$ 1 per unit (i.e. per mcf) of gas sold to Tata will imply a subsidy of US\$ 68 million annually -or US\$ 83 million if captive power for the steel plant were to be generated from gas instead of coal. Against this, the direct benefit from Tata's operations will consist of an estimated US\$ 20 to US\$ 30 annually in terms of salaries and another US\$ 38 million in tax revenue estimated as the annual equivalent of the tax payments to be made by Tata with a ten-year tax the report handed to Bol Executive Chairman Mahmudur Rahman says.

The indirect benefits from Tata's projects will come from the balance of payments support and from the positive spillover effects on other sectors created through outsourcing and the purchase of inputs. "While these benefits are impor-

tant, the report produced by the Economic Intelligence Unit (EIU) of the Economist makes highly exaggerated claims in these respects," he said. In estimating the indirect impact on other sectors, it ignores the fact that the expansion of production activities in an economy like Bangladesh is generally constrained by lack of inadequate production capacity rather than by

He estimated that Tata's operations will provide balance of payments support of \$628 annually through net exports and \$323 through import

"The actual balance of payments support will be of course much lower because of the repatriation of profits -a fact that has been curiously overooked in the EIU report," Prof Mahmud said.

On the face of it. Prof Mahmud observed, the proposed steel-power complex appears promising, since it combines the advantage of the availability of iron ore and energy resources in India and Bangladesh respectively 'However, many strategic issues need to be resolved, particularly regarding infrastructure provision, land acquisition and the feasibility of coal mining,

Tata's projected profits from the nvestments seem to be large enough, particularly for the steel-power comolex, so as to provide ample scopes for bargaining in order to arrive at a fair win-win deal, the report said.

Even for this integrated project, the possibility of generating power by gas and thus leaving out the coal mining component may be kept open as an alternative, given the many unresolved issues regarding coal mining."
