

Rajshahi Division's pensive 24-hour wait was finally over yesterday afternoon when Chittagong crashed to a six-wicket defeat against Barisal only to confirm their maiden first-class title on the final day of the Ispahani Seventh National Cricket

Rajshahi, who recorded a tenwicket win over outgoing champions Dhaka with a day in hand in the fourday match on Sunday, became the first team to complete a rare double by winning both the one-day and four-day trophies in one season. Raishahi ended on 40 points

after six outright wins from ten rounds while runners-up Chittagong, who had a two-point lead after nine rounds, finished with 36 points. Chittagong also finished runners-up in the limited-overs competition by virtue of a better net run-rate after finishing on equal 12

The victory in the tenth round

gave Barisal third place -- their best finish ever in the league -- with 33 points while Khulna, who lost to Sylhet by nine wickets, were bottom of the table with 15, 13 points adrift of Dhaka and Sylhet

Set to score 145 to win. Barisal lost their third wicket with the addition of only nine runs to their overnight 39-2 in the final morning at the Barisal Stadium. But that was all the excitement Chittagong could produce in a bid to keep their slim title hopes alive as the home side coasted to the target before lunch.

# **Prolific Ricky leads** Aus march

Australian captain Ricky Ponting scored two centuries in a match for the third time this season before setting Australia a victory target of 410 on the fourth day of the second Test against South Africa at Kingsmead on Monday.

Ponting made 116 and Matthew Hayden hit 102 as Australia piled up 307 for four before declaring shortly before tea. South Africa needed to bat out a possible 131 overs to avoid a series-deciding second successive defeat. They were 19 for no wicket at tea. It was the second time in three Tests that Ponting, who made 103 in the first innings, made two centuries in a Test against South Africa. He made two hundreds in his 100th Test appearance

against the West Indies in Brisbane Ponting is only the second man

to have scored two centuries in a match on three occasions in a career, joining India's Sunil Gavaskar The Australian captain has

enjoyed an extraordinary run feast against South Africa this summer. He made 515 runs at an average of 103 when the sides met in a threematch series in Australia. He has made 294 runs in four

innings in the current series. It was his fifth century in his last eight innings against South Africa and the seventh of his career against them.

It was Ponting's 30th Test century, taking him ahead of Don Bradman to fifth place on an all-time list headed by Sachin Tendulkar of India, who has made 35. Steve

Waugh, on 32, is the only Australian

Ponting and Hayden were seldom troubled as they put on 201 in a second wicket stand which took the match beyond South Africa's reach.

Ponting reached his century off 166 balls, while Hayden needed 209 to reach the same mark. The lefthanded Hayden took 130 balls to reach his fifty before picking up the pace of his batting, hitting some powerful offside shots, as he moved to his 26th Test century and his sixth against South Africa.

Ponting looked in total command and played some fine strokes, including a pulled six off Shaun Pollock. He was eventually out caught at deep square leg trying to force the pace ahead of a declaration.

I can assure you that when the inaugural edition of the tournament involving the emerging nations of Asia begins everything will be perfectly in order," said Fazlur Rahman yesterday at a press briefing at the BFF Bhaban.

Rahman, also the co-chairman of the local organising committee, informed that major renovation works of Bangabandhu National Stadium, one of two venues for the 16-nation meet, have been completed.

"You will find everything ready on the morning of April 1 and I hope the guests will enjoy new facilities at the Bangabandhu National Stadium which will be able to host a capacity 36,000 crowd," assured the sports

advanced party to see the progress of preparation, said that FIFA president Sepp Blatter will grace the opening ceremony of the biggest football festival to be held in Bangladesh since the Asian Youth

Championship way back in 1978. Blatter will arrive in Dhaka on Friday night from Zurich by his personal jet while AFC chief Mohammad Bin Hammam will arrive on the same morning from Doha. Blatter is expected to call on President Dr. Prof lajuddin Ahmed Saturday morning.


