

After two matches were abandoned in the group stages and had to be replayed, the quarterfinals in Dhaka have been put off by a day and now will be played on April 9 and 10 instead of April 8 and 9 respec-

Hosts Bangladesh will take on Group D runners-ups on April 10.

The date for the semifinal remains unchanged but the kick-off time at the capital has been brought

forward to 3.30pm from 5pm. In Chittagong, the quarterfinals and semifinal dates remain unchanged but the kick-off times have been also advanced to

The kickoff time for the April 16 will be announced later.

vesterday. Tajikistan, who have a superior goal difference in the so-called group of death, finished top of the table with six points. The remaining qualifiers will he decided after today's rematch between Kyrgyzstan and Macau. The match, earlier abandoned due to

Pakistan ended with four points while Kyrgyzstan and Macau have three and one point respectively. A draw would be enough for Kyrgyzstan to reach the knockout stage on basis of goal difference but if they lose, it would be open for
