She demanded of the government to ensure equal wage for women workers, amendment to labour laws, and sharing of total profit. While presenting the keynote paper at the roundtable, Prof Nasreen Khundker of Dhaka University said women's participation in economic activities increased to 26 percent in 2001-03 which was 16 percent in 1995-96.
