New US envoy hopes govt, opposition to talk out differences

The new US ambassador in Dhaka yesterday expressed her confi-dence that Bangladesh will once again "flourish" with its democratic tradition with the upcoming

Patricia A Butenis, who arrived here on April 3 and presented her credentials to the president on April 13, hoped that the govern-ment and the opposition will talk out their political disagreements and ensure free and fair elections.

The 12th US envoy in Bangladesh at the outset of her tenure yesterday termed Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Ziaur Rahman the two "architects of Bangladesh's independence" and paid her rich tributes to them.

She said the ideals of these two leaders are the resources of the people of this country.

Volatile turn in politics shadows reform talks

14-party announces 'Dhaka siege' May 21; BNP rallies on Tuesday

The prospect of a governmentopposition dialogue on electoral reforms appears slim, as the government is still undecided about the composition of its negotiation team and the mainstream opposition camp more inclined to street

The politics seems to heading for another bout of confrontation following a week of violence over a youth rally of the main opposition, a 14-party sit-in programme, and hartal, with the Awami League-led 14-party opposition line-up yesterday announcing a Dhaka-siege programme for May 21.

The opposition combine yesterday also announced a set of fresh programmes including rallies and processions in Dhaka and other

parts of the country against price hike of essentials, power crisis, Islamist militancy, unabated corruption, and repression on journalists and opposition members.

The combine enforces a daylong hartal today in protest of what it said were police atrocities on April-19 to foil its sit-in programme in front of the Prime Minister's Office.

Meantime, in Tangail the local chapter of the main opposition Awami League (AL) yesterday locked horn with police protesting an imposition of the Section 144 of Criminal Procedure Code at and around its meeting venue. The clash left about 20 people injured.

The ruling alliance too has gone for a tough stance and announced to face the opposition in the street with counter programmes

The ruling BNP will stage demonstration rallies across the country Tuesday protesting what it terms the anarchic politics of the opposition, BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan announced from a rally in the capital last Friday.

Against this background of frequent police-opposition clashes, political analysts predict more street violence in the coming

Sources said the 14-party lineup is focusing more on the ongoing street agitation to keep on pressure on the government, which has only six months remaining of its term.

In regard to the proposed dialogue, analysts say BNP's coalition partner Jamaat-e-Islami stands as a barrier between the AL and BNP.

A US citizen of Bangladeshi origin, Ehsanul Islam Sadequee, who was picked up on April 17 from the capital, is in the custody of the US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), BBC Bangla Service reported yesterday.

A US government attorney confirmed to BBC that Sadequee was supposed to be produced before the Federal Court in New York yesterday for his suspected involvement with Islamist militancy. An FBI special agent was supposed to officially press charges against him in the court.

and said the US does not have any extradition treaty with Bangladesh. Consul General of Bangladesh in New York Kazi Imtiaz Hossain also confirmed to BBC that the US does not have any extradition treaty with Bangladesh. However, he declined to comment on how then Sadequee was extradited to the US.

A US attorney's office told BBC that there had been a warrant issued through Interpol for arrest of Sadequee and possibly he was extradited based on that warrant.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh government and the police authorities continue to keep mum about how Sadequee ended up in FBI custody. Police officials concerned



BUS PLUNGE 12 bodies found so far, 23 missing

Twelve bodies have so far been found after a bus carrying 45 people of a wedding party plunged into the river Chitra at Shimkhali ferry point in Narail on Friday.

A Navy forklift pulled the bus ashore early yesterday.

The recovered bodies are of newly wed bride Lipi Biswas, 20. her cousin Pali, 15, Sukanta Basu, 19, Tanusri, 14, Anusri, 9, Silata, 29, Dipti Rani, 30, Arpana Rani, 26, Antu Biswas, 2, Subarni, 15, Swadesh Roy, 55 and Shampa, 14.

The bodies of Lipi and Pali were sent to Manikhar village in Gopalganj Sadar upazila while those of others were taken to Rumdia village under Narail Sardar upazila yesterday.
